A new all-star crew is heading up Antigua's Classic Yacht Regatta, set for April 17 to 29, 2019. Elected in November were chairman Carlo Falcone, vice-chairman Cameron Fraser, Antiqua Yacht Club commodore Franklyn Braithwaite, competitor liaison officer Tommy Paterson, treasurer Janie Easton, financial advisor Don Ward, and program editor, social media and sponsor liaison, Gilly Gobinet. 

Following an All-American collegiate sailing career, four Congressional Cup wins and a ranking as the world's number one match racer for three of the past five years, 29-year-old Taylor Canfield is ready for his biggest sailing challenge yet. On December 12, the Long Beach Yacht Club, in Long Beach, California, announced its entry, Stars & Stripes Team USA, was formally accepted by the Defender and Royal New Zealand Yacht Squadron as the fifth Challenger of the 36th America's Cup. Canfield co-founded the team with fellow professional American sailor, Mike Buckley.

"The chief focus will always be to get as much support as we can," says Canfield, who has wanted to win the America's Cup since his Opti days and in the wake of fellow Virgin Islander, Peter Holmberg. "This being from fans and emotional supporters all the way to financial supporters. It is our goal to make our team as inclusive as possible and inspire generations to come. In addition to this, at this early stage we have some everyday business to handle including getting a boat built, filling out the rest of the team (shore and sailors), and of course for me getting more time on the water and in the gym."

The team's name is a nod to Dennis Conner's 'Stars & Stripes' campaigns that defined all-American, America's Cup racing for decades. starsandstripesteamusa.americascup.com



# THREE GENERATIONS OF BOATING HISTORY: WALLY CASTRO MARINE

ood-built boats ruled the waves in Puerto Rico and the wider Caribbean back in the 1950's and early 1960's. It took the vision of one man, Mario Castro, a dealer for Cummings-brand engines, to foresee the next trend on the water would be fiberglass boats. Today, grandson Wally Castro owns and operates the third generation of the family boating business. Castro, at his namesake Wally Castro Marine located at Marina Puerto Del Rey in Fajardo, has put his signature stamp on the yacht sales and service company and wider marine industry, as did his father, Wally Castro Sr., before him. In doing so, the Castro family have long promoted boating in Puerto Rico and surrounding U.S. and British Virgin Islands.

"My grandfather liked to have the latest and he was the first in Puerto Rico to bring in a fiberglass boat. No one wanted to buy the boat because they thought that since it was plastic it would break and sink. He ended up modifying it by putting jet engines on the back and a hose with nozzle on the front and finally sold it to the fire department," Castro explains.

Castro's father continued the fiberglass trend by taking on a line of 'wiener' boats. Narrow and long, like the nickname for the dachshund breed of dog of the same build, the craft were fitted internally with foam to make them unsinkable. Castro was a young boy at the time and remembers a promotion for the boat that showed it full of water, yet still floating. From there, the then named Industrial Marine Services company, located in Santurce with its small showroom at the Cangrejos Yacht Club, added brands such as Sea Ray, Hydra Sports and Bertram.

"The brand that turned us around was the Phoenix Marine 29. It was the first twin diesel, with cabin room for six adults, a generator and air-conditioning. That's the boat young professionals would buy and take their families out for the weekend. My father would get 12 to 14 boats together and everyone would go to Culebra. That's how the first culture of rafting up started," says Castro.

It was his father that schooled Castro in the boating business.

"I always joke that I never played basketball in school, instead I played with tools in the marina. After school, I'd work with my father on the warranties and servicing. He was my best teacher. Later, I started my own company, a brokerage, within his company. I really enjoyed servicing the used boats and then selling them," he says.

Castro's father passed away in 2005. After that, he took his company to Fajardo and used his inherited foresight to grow the business.

"I saw a change in the industry. People wanted high end boats, so we became dealers for quality brands and brands that represented a wide variety of what people enjoy on the water. For example, Boston Whalers are ideal for cruising and entertaining. Regulator and Wellcraft outboards and Jarratt Bay and Bertram inboards for sports fishing. Nor-Tech offers speed and Riviera are luxury motor yachts. We are also dealers for Belize, SeaForce IX and Blackfin," says Castro.

The most recent highlights in Castro's career is his company being named the No. 1 Boston Whaler dealer in Latin America and the Caribbean in 2017, a distinction he's earned six other times in the past decade and achieving the world's first sale of Boston Whaler's 420 Outrage in 2015.

Castro's professional and personal contributions span beyond the showroom and service center. He is the founder of Christmas in July, an event that saw 229 boats rendezvous in Savannah Bay, Virgin Gorda, in the British Virgin Islands. He took a page out of his father's pioneering raft up days to create a week-long event that filled marinas, restaurants and shops as well as fulfilled what he loves best about boating.

"There is no better way to spend family time than on a boat. If you are at a hotel, it's easy for each family member to go in different directions. But on a boat, you can spend a lot of quality time together," he says.

Family is definitely important to Castro. His two oldest daughters now also working in the family business, along with 19 other employees who collectively make the company full service from new sales to resales, warranties and servicing. Wally Castro Marine is a certified Raymarine and Garmin dealer as well as service dealer for Mercury and Suzuki outboard engines.

Castro is also building for the future – literally. The company broke ground on a new showroom and office complex in Puerto del Rey in early 2018. This building, expected to open in February or March, will put the entire business under one roof and will make it the largest facility of its kind in Puerto Rico.

What's next?

"Technology is the next big trend in the marine industry," Castro says. "We will soon offer a phone app that connects directly to our service department. After all, my vision is to give the best service possible to keep families in boating."

### THE UNSINKABLE PASSIONS OF SAILOR LIN PARDEY

SAILING HUMOR BY CAP'N FATTY GOODLANDER



his is a story about Thanksgiving—my favorite American holiday. Why do I enjoy Thanksgiving so much? Because it is a non-commercial holiday about being grateful. What am I grateful for? I'm grateful for people who encourage others—and I'm especially grateful for people who encourage aspiring sailors to live their watery dreams.

My favorite destination to celebrate American Thanksgiving where I've joyously celebrated many of them over the last two decades—is a tiny island off the east coast of New Zealand.

Another trendy topic I'm currently intrigued with is decluttering, downsizing, and simplifying. I really believe in the mantra of 'go simple, go small, go now.'

I am not alone. Many sailors, as our planet burns, desire a more minimalistic, less carbon-intensive lifestyle.

Of course, there's nothing new under the sun. I've already lived through one 'back to the farm' youth movement and I am sure there will be others. The truth is that *more* doesn't necessarily translate to better. Good things can come in small packages.

This brings us to the pint-sized author/sailor named Lin Pardey. She isn't merely a dear and diminutive friend; she is a larger-than-life intellectual tour-de-force. Her back-to-basics cruising concepts have nurtured my wife Carolyn and I for nearly half a century of offshore sailing—while inspiring thousands of hopeful sailors at the same time.

Another trendy topic I'm currently intrigued with is decluttering, downsizing, and simplifying. I really believe in the mantra of 'go simple, go small, go now.' I am not alone. Many sailors, as our planet burns, desire a more minimalistic, less carbon-intensive lifestyle.

In many regards, Lin is our marine community's first strong-willed feminist—a traditional Renaissance woman of all things nautical. Her literary and life accomplishments are almost too numerous to mention. *Legend* is a word often misused—but not in relationship to Lin.

Lin is more than a skillful fellow marine writer—she has been a lifelong moral compass. How? By having firm convictions and steadfastly acting on them. Do I agree with all of them? Of course not. But I respect Lin because she has earned the right to her opinions. Anyone can say they prefer the purity of not having a stinky, oil-smeared engine aboard—few can back those words with an east-to-west circumnavigation, a west-to-east circumnavigation, and then toss in a rounding of Cape Horn just for good measure.

Parts of Lin's life story are familiar: she, along with her Canadian husband Larry, built a Lyle Hess 24-foot engineless cutter named *Seraffyn* in the late '60s. They promptly sailed that traditional wooden craft around the world, then built *Taleisin*, a 29-foot version of the same concept, for their second circ. Along the watery way they collected the Cruising Club of America's Far Horizon Award and the Seven Seas Cruis-



ing Association's Lifetime Achievement Award—as well at the Ocean Cruising Club's Merit Award.

Concurrently, in order to fund their adventures, Lin penned a dozen marine books such as Cruising Seraffyn, Seraffyn's European (and Mediterranean and Oriental) Adventures, Storm Tactics, The Cost Conscious Cruiser, The Self Sufficient Sailor, The Capable Cruiser, Taleisin's Tales, The Care and Feeding of the Offshore Crew, Bull Canyon, and Details of Classic Boat Construction.

What else? Plenty!

Of course, there's nothing new under the sun. I've already lived through one 'back to the farm' youth movement and I am sure there will be others. The truth is that more doesn't necessarily translate to better. Good things can come in small packages.

Herb McCormick, one of my editors at Cruising World, wrote their biography As Long as It's Fun: the Epic Voyages and Extraordinary Times of Lin and Larry Pardey. In between hustling books at boat shows and regularly giving cruising seminars in America and Europe, Lin continued to write her how-to articles—and even produced a series of popular how-to DVD videos (long before the YouTube era).

Not content with mere writing, Lin then started publishing other marine books under the L&L imprint as well. Titles include Blown Away by Herb Payson and Voyaging with Kids: a Guide to Family Life Afloat written by Behan Gifford, Sara Dawn Johnson, and Michael Robertson (with an introduction by that crazy Cap'n Fatty).

All of the above is, as noted, well documented.

What people might not realize is that Lin is a fun-loving, gregarious, wine-swilling party gal as well—a hostess equally adept at entertaining her guests in a tiny cockpit or a commodious beach house along the shore.

I guess what I'm hinting at is that Lin and Larry eventually washed ashore on a tiny rock in New Zealand called Kawau.

Grateful for discovering their own Shangri-la, they celebrated

their first Thanksgiving on Kawau by having a great feast and inviting both their cruising friends and some locals.

Thus began a culinary tradition that is not only locally famous but well-known in distant foreign cruising ports as well. "We spent Turkey Day with the Pardey's on Kawau," is whispered with pride not only at the NY and San Francisco yacht clubs and the Royal New Zealand Yacht Squadron—but also in numerous fist-banged rumshops from Borneo to Madagascar, from Cocos Keeling to Cape Town.

This year (2018), there were 37 guests—and while some of the local Kiwis attending resided ashore, all shared a lust of adventure and a love of Lin.

Of course, in every life some rain must fall—and perhaps the most cherished marine marriage (48 wonderful years) dimmed as Larry fell ill with Parkinson's and slipped into dementia in 2016. He is currently in a full-care facility close to Kawau. Lin visits often.

But Lin is an indomitable spirit—and Americans are known for reinventing themselves during their Second Acts. And at 75, Lin is still a sassy romantic. And you know what they say about sailors and every port.

This year's festivities were co-hosted by Lin Pardey and an Aussie legal environmentalist named David Haigh. Yes, of course he has circumnavigated aboard his Van de Stadt-designed 40-foot Sahula—who hasn't made a global circle or two in Lin's worldwide watery entourage?

How was the perfectly staged sit-down Thanksgiving meal that took two hours plus to consume?

The dueling turkeys—one oven cooked and the other barbequed—were perfect. And this year I was wise enough not to gorge on bird alone—so I had plenty of room for the six (homemade whipped cream was to die for) desserts.

Where, in our humble opinion, is the best port on the planet for a sailor to spend an American Thanksgiving? Why, Kawau Island on the northern rim of the Gulf of Hauraki, of course.






The poor woman was almost comatose but managed to point to her hapless partner who, by this time, was not far away.

Any resemblance to a Caribbean cruise was quickly dismissed as 25 knots of solid trade winds with gusty squalls and a confused sea state delivered a challenge to over 1000 sailors from six different continents!

George David's American Maxi Rambler 88 scorched around









the track to set a new monohull course record of 37 hours 41 minutes and 45 seconds and was declared overall winner of the RORC Caribbean 600 Trophy.

In 2019, entries include the largest privately owned yacht in the world, Athos, at 203ft, together with the three fastest ocean-going trimarans Maserati, PowerPlay and Argos.

Chris Stone, RORC Racing Manager says, "We are delighted to be back in Antigua for the 11th edition of the event for which we are expecting close to 100 boats from all over the world, coming to Antigua to enjoy the challenging racing and amazing weather. We should have an extremely good mix within the fleet, seeing our smallest competitors tussling with the larger race machines for the prestigious IRC overall trophy - not forgetting our famous Caribbean 600 social programme! 

/hen disaster strikes onboard an assessment must be made whether to abandon the vessel. The criteria for abandonment are straightforward, if the boat is sinking or there is a fire aboard that can't be contained and extinguished, it is time to abandon ship immediately. Otherwise, stay with the boat, as it is a much larger target for the search and rescue teams. If temporary repairs can be made to delay sinking, everyone has additional time to prepare to abandon ship.

#### **GETTING READY FOR ABANDONMENT**

- Alert the crew to prepare to abandon ship. Keeping calm is the first order of business. Quickly assigning tasks to assist getting ready will aid the preparation.
- Don lifejackets. If there is enough time to put on extra clothing plus foul weather gear, it will help to stay warm and dry.
- Transmit a distress call. Press the "distress" button on the DSC (Digital Selective Calling) enabled VHF radio, followed by a voice mayday call.
- Turn the EPIRB on. After activation, the EPIRB will be taken aboard the liferaft along with the ditch bag.
- Grab the ditch bag. A pre-packed abandon ship bag with all the necessities needed to supplement the survival equipment packed with the liferaft, including a waterproof handheld VHF radio and SART (Search and Rescue Transponder), should be readily accessible. If extra time permits, gather additional water, non-perishable food, extra distress pyrotechnics, blankets, medications, passports, binoculars, hand bearing compass and first aid kits.
- Position the liferaft for launching. A liferaft should be stowed where it is readily accessible in case of an emergency. The bottom of a locker underneath dock lines and deck brushes is a poor choice for a storage location.

#### **DEPLOYING THE LIFERAFT**

- Secure the painter. Using a strongpoint, such as a cleat or padeye, tie the liferaft painter to the boat. Double check the knot or hitch used to make sure the liferaft will not drift away once inflated.
- Launch the raft downwind. Heave the liferaft canister or valise overboard to leeward, this will help provide a modicum of protection from wind and waves when boarding and avoid potential damage to the raft when inflated.
- Pull the painter. Life raft painters are long; they can be as long as 50 feet. Keep pulling out the painter from the floating canister until it is taut. Then give it a sharp tug, this activates the inflation by piercing the CO2 canister.
- Secure the liferaft close to the boat. Once fully inflated, quickly trim in the painter and cleat it off so the liferaft is close enough to the boat for boarding.





• Board the liferaft. The goal is to board the liferaft directly from the vessel and not from the water. Staying out of the water is essential to remain as dry and warm as possible. Don't forget to load the ditch bag and any other spare items collected.

#### ONCE ABOARD THE LIFERAFT

**Initial actions.** There are four actions to be taken immediately:

- Cut the painter with the blunt-tipped safety knife secured at the liferaft's entrance.
- Stream the sea anchor to slow the rate of drift. A SOLAS approved liferaft will automatically deploy its sea anchor.
- Close the entrance flap to keep the wind, waves and rain
- Maintain the liferaft by keeping it as dry as possible. Bailing scoops and sponges are included in the survival service pack.

#### Subsequent actions.

- Attach the EPIRB's security line to the raft so it can float in the water nearby.
- Distribute seasick tablets and use them immediately.
- Give first aid to any injured crew.
- Inventory survival items in the raft.
- Apportion food and water for rationing.
- Do not eat or drink water for the first 24 hours.
- Stay warm and dry.
- Maintain an active watch to look for other vessels or aircraft.
- Keep morale high, the will to survive is a key factor while awaiting rescue.

Prior training makes handling emergency situations more successful. All boats should have their crew practice conducting abandon ship drills, which include muster stations and preassigned preparation tasks. Practice builds confidence and reduces panic when an actual emergency occurs.

It is also helpful to get to know the liferaft stowed on board. When it is time for the scheduled liferaft service, observe the liferaft when it is manually inflated and tested for leaks prior to repacking. Become familiar with the raft's construction and placement of the safety gear on board.

# CAROL BAREUTHER TALKS TO CAPTAIN COLLEEN KORONA OF S/V FIREFLY

#### **SEAMANSHIP & VOYAGING**



he old saying that 'when one door closes another door opens' certainly applies to the career of Captain Colleen Korona. In fact, it was twice being unemployed that led Korona to her dream career as a yacht captain. Today, she is at the helm of the Leopard 46 catamaran, Firefly, term chartering year-round in the U.S. and British Virgin Islands.

Though having entered her preferred profession later than some of her peers, salt water started flowing through the Florida native's veins at an early age.


"My uncle was an avid surfer and sailor," says Korona. "He always had Hobie cats and surfboards laying around and never hesitated to say, 'Give it a try! Don't worry about breaking it, just have fun."

Korona worked a shoreside nine to five job for many years managing a mental health office and nuclear brain imaging facility. Then, the US economic market crashed and she was out of a job. A few years later, she and a friend sailed north from Key West to Block Island, then from Hampton, Virginia to Tortola, BVI on a 38-foot Shannon. The two stayed and played in the Virgins for a while, before continuing south to Trinidad & Tobago. It was during this time that Korona started picking up a paid charter gig here and there. This led to a crew position for several seasons aboard a historic tall ship that sailed the Virgins. One day, the ship was struck by a car ferry traveling to Spanish Town. The next day, Korona found herself unemployed again.

"I had been complacent in my position as first mate/stewardess and deckhand, but unemployment basically forced me to take the next step and get my captain's license," she tells.

Substantial sea time is one of the requirements for a captain's license. Korona had many miles under her belt cruising aboard the Shannon. However, once she began working on charter boats her hours increased substantially. This included sails north to the US East Coast from the Caribbean, and working aboard vessels that included day boats, term charters, monohulls, catamarans, trimarans and power yachts. One of these was a beautifully restored classic 85-foot Trumpy motoryacht whose owner cruised throughout New York, Rhode Island and Maine. Since becoming licensed, Korona has run catamarans from 44- to 53-feet, delivered a 44-foot trawler from Fort Lauderdale to the BVI, oversaw a \$120,000 refit on a 43-foot cat and delivered it from the USVI to Port Canaveral, and is now aboard Firefly.

"I admit it took me awhile to settle into the role and get com-





fortable with the responsibility of someone's expensive vessel and the people on it, but captaining is a perfect fit for me and it's a great profession if you have the people skills and stamina. General duties include, keeping the boat clean inside and out, engine maintenance, being able to repair general electric items, fix broken heads or showers, change out pumps, oversee and coordinate major repairs as well as correspondence with guests and owners. I always laugh and say a captain's license just makes you a glorified plumber and mechanic. You must be able to adapt to the boat, weather and guests needs. That means never saying, 'That's not my job,'" she says.

Korona claims she sees more women every year enter the marine industry at the helm. The only challenges, she says,

is occasionally not being taken seriously by mechanics and yard workers.

To those who would like to follow in Korona's wake, she advises: "Just do it! There is definitely a niche for female captains and I think women get a pretty good reception overall from brokers and owners. You would be surprised at how many bookings we get because I am a female captain. It does set us apart. Of course, my boyfriend/mate's amazing cooking is a big factor too!"

# TEN TOP CARIBBEAN SNORKELING DESTINATIONS

f you swim, you can snorkel. Easier than diving as no certification isn't required, all you need is a mask and snorkel to see a whole other side of the Caribbean the underwater one, that is. If you don't have this basic equipment, no worries. Many of the ten top snorkeling spots below are near rental vendors.

#### 1. Providenciales, Turks & Caicos.

A great locale to snorkel with kids is the Bight Reef. It's easy to see why this spot is also called Coral Gardens. A long shallow ridge of hard and soft coral extends out from shore. Common sightings include sea turtles, rays and fish such as Nassau groupers, parrotfish, colorful sergeant majors and porcupinefish. A sugar soft white sand beach ashore makes an idyllic place to rest after snorkeling.




#### 2. Negril, Jamaica.

Calm, warm water with visibility over 60 feet make snorkeling a joy here for first-timers and veteran snorkelers. Rockhouse in western Negril is a fantastical area with submarine caves teeming with finned critters and other sea life. Seven Mile Beach is also a popular snorkeling destination. Cliffs above the beach are a perfect perch to spec out what part of the reef you've like to snorkel.

#### 3. The Baths, Virgin Gorda, British Virgin Islands.

This playground of giant granite boulders that mark the island's iconic southwest coast is a paradise for snorkelers. Arrive here by boat and dive in. Or, walk down to the beach on the short, clearlymarked yet somewhat rocky trail leading from the Top of the Baths restaurant. Plentiful schools of rainbow-colored fish are the main undersea attraction. Yet, climbing around the boulders and seafilled grottos between them is great shoreside fun.





#### 4. Green Island, Antigua.

Located off the east coast of Antigua, this uninhabited island owned by the private Mill Reef Club is full of pristine white sand beaches that offer a perfect gateway into the sea beyond. The best snorkeling is over the reef right offshore. Charter operators bring guests here for snorkel trips, but other than this, the area is quiet and relatively isolated. After all, the only way to get to here is by boat. Plan to bring a picnic and spend the day sunning, swimming and snorkeling.



#### 5. Scotts Head, Dominica.

Known for its stunning scuba diving, the Soufriere Scotts Head Marine Reserve situated off this southwest coastal village of Scotts Head is also ideal for snorkeling. One of the best sites is the Champagne Reef. Named for the water bubbles that float up from the volcanic hot springs on the sea floor, this area is a real underwater zoo. It's filled with all kinds of coral, sponges, anemones, lobster, and multicolored fish. Snorkeling gear is available to rent nearby.

#### 6. Rockley Beach, Barbados.

Snorkeling is just some of the fun on this beach, also called Accra Beach, which is a favorite among locals and visitors alike. Calm to moderate waves, no undertow and a sandy beach entry make snorkeling easy. Lots of colorful fish, sea turtles and even an occasional ray are the chief underwater draws. Souvenir vendors, sun lounger and umbrella rentals, and beach bars and restaurants are also here. Additionally, two miles to the north at Browne's Beach, one of the island's largest beaches, there are several sunken ships about 100 yards offshore that are spectacular to snorkel.




#### 7. Mayreau, St. Vincent & the Grenadines.

The magical reefs around this smallest of the inhabited Grenadine islands are nicknamed the Mayreau Gardens and are home to some of the greatest biodiversity in the region. Managed and protected by the Tobago Cays Marine Park, there is a wealth of sea life: turtles, rays, nurse and reef sharks as well as corals, sea fans and corals. The island is reachable only by boat since there is no airstrip.

#### 8. Tobago Cays, St. Vincent & the Grenadines.

See sea turtles feed on the sea grass growing in the clear shallow waters off the Baradal Turtle Sanctuary. Located on an island in the center of the Cays, this protected area is home to green, hawksbill and leatherback turtles. The reefs here are also swimmingly full of other sea creatures like corals, conch and spiny lobster. The current can sometimes be strong, so fins are helpful. Reach the Tobago Cays by yacht or day charter from the mainland.









#### 9. Buccoo Reef, Tobago.

Shallow reefs rim much of Trinidad's sibling island, making it easy to snorkel right off the beach. One of the best places is Buccoo Reef, a protected marine park located between Buccoo Point and Pigeon Point. Head to the western part of this area for the best snorkeling. Do be aware of boat traffic in this area and to the north as glass bottom boats take visitors to the reef daily. Rent snorkeling equipment from vendors on the beach.



#### 10. Klein Curacao, Curacao.

Look but don't touch applies to the snorkeling off of this 1/2-square-mile uninhabited island at the southeast of mainland Curacao. That's because sea turtles are one of the prime sights. This advice also applies to the sensational stands of coral and countless fish. The island is only reachable by boat. What makes the one-hour one-way ride really memorable is the frequent bottlenose dolphin escort. Moorings off Klein Curacao are mainly for day tour boats.



# SAINT CROIX TAKES PART IN GLOBAL SLAVE WRECKS

ew light on maritime history from the Caribbean's dark days of slavery may soon be on display at the Virgin Islands National Park's (VINP) Fort Christiansvaern museum in St. Croix. The seeds for this enterprise were sown a decade ago with the launch of the originally-named Southern African Slave Wrecks and Diasporan Heritage Routes Project. The project's goal was, and remains, to combine research, training and education to better understand the realities of the global slave trade, especially via slave shipwrecks. The project's Phase I research efforts concentrated in Southern Africa. Phase II kicked-off in 2012, when the name was shortened to the Slave Wrecks Project (SWP) and widened in geographic scope to reflect the far-reaching slave trade. Since one of the SWP's core partners is the U.S. National Park Service (NPS), it was a

natural to look at slave wrecks within park waters. Two such areas were identified: the Biscayne National Park in Florida and Virgin Islands National Park in St. Croix.

"The reason for our interest in St. Croix is that there are a lot of shipwrecks," explains Meredith Hardy, Ph.D., an archeologist with the NPS Southeast Archeological Center, in Tallahassee, Florida, who, with project colleagues, presented a talk on the SWP work on St. Croix in July. "Research shows some 114 wrecks between the years of 1523 and 1917, when Denmark sold the Virgin Islands to the US. Records show that the first enslaved Africans arrived in 1630, brought by the English, followed by the Dutch and French in 1650. The slave trade was ended in the Danish West Indies in 1792, but the importation of slaves didn't stop until a decade after."

Two of the shipwrecks identified are the Mary and the General Abercrombie. The English-flagged 150-ton Mary departed from Cameroon with 266 slaves aboard in 1797. All these people were rescued when the ship was wrecked on Buck Island. The Buck Island Reef National Monument is one of three national parks on St. Croix. The second was the English-flagged, 328-ton, General Abercrombie, which sailed from the Congo until she too wrecked on the coral heads off Buck Island in 1803. This grounding took place off the back side of the island and in the dark of night, a sneaky move owing to the fact it was 11 years after the ending of the slave trade.

"Part of the purpose of the SWP is to provide experience and training in heritage resource protection for future generations. To this end, we introduced student interns from the University of the Virgin Islands (UVI) to archeological science and cultural resource management first hand. This started on the heels of a two-year magnetometer survey of Buck Island's waters by professionals at the NPS's Submerged Resources Center. Survey results showed a total of 239 targets. These included anchors, chain and partial hulls filled with Danish brick. Each of these targets were visited by staff or students by snorkeling or scuba diving and documented. Of note, all cultural resources in federal waters are protected by the National Historic Preservation Act (1966) and several other laws - federal, state, and territorial."



One partnership that has assisted in making dive training possible for the student interns is the SWP and NPS's collaboration with the groups, Diving with a Purpose and the National Association of Black Scuba Divers.

However, since the underwater aspect of the project is limited in the number of people who can participate, the SWP in St. Croix has also moved ashore. Over the past few years,









UVI student interns and researchers have excavated the grounds of the Danish West Indies & Guinea Co.'s Warehouse complex along the Christiansted Wharf. This was the area where most enslaved Africans entered the island after arriving by ship.

"Ultimately, the interns will work with the NPS researchers to create exhibits for museum spaces, websites and social media," says Hardy.







t. Lucia's Frederic 'Freddy' Sweeney and his team certainly had the right attitude as they set sail in the 2018 Mango Bowl Regatta, hosted by the St. Lucia Yacht Club, November 30 to December 2. That is, "We just went out and tried to have as much fun as possible and that's what usually gets us to the top," says Sweeney, whose team of Dylan Charles, Ryan Alexander, Erik Simmons and Ricardo Charmon championed the highly competitive J/24 class. Sweeney's J/24, Attitude, was one of 20 boats with over 100 sailors from St. Lucia, Martinique, Barbados, Trinidad, Grenada.

"Conditions were gusty and fluctuating winds. There was also a small swell rolling into the bay, which made mark roundings interesting. I'd have to say, though, our starts are what really made it for us. We raced in the combined J/24 Surprise class where there were 14 boats on the start line and we managed good starts almost every race. From there, it was usually a matter of just holding position," says Sweeney whose team is a well-oiled machine having sailed together for a long time and whose class sailed 9 races in two days. "Most people like the Mango Bowl because there is lots of racing, plus the parties are great."

In other results, Martinique's Jean-Pierre Leny's Lady Blue won the racing class. In cruising, Barbados' David Spieler's Leonora topped the scoreboard. Meanwhile, Martinique's Nicolas Gillet's Helium finished first in both the Surprise class and combined J/24/Surprise class.

"We would love to have a bigger cruising and racing classes next year," says regatta director, Lily Bergasse. "This year, we decided to finish racing at noon on the last day. We held the BBQ Prize Giving soon after on the beach in front of the St. Lucia Yacht Club, where boats could simply anchor off the beach, be shuttled in and then sail off home in the mid afternoon or stick around a day to make it north or south home to neighboring islands."

Organizers aimed to maintain their Silver certification as part of the Sailors for the Sea Clean Regattas program in several ways. One was a clean-up of Reduit Beach as part of the Keep St. Lucia Clean and Green campaign. Others were no single use plastic employed in the regatta. Crews were offered reusable water bottles and there was a water station manned by volunteers from Caribbean Student Environmental Alliance (Caribbean SEA).

Next year's Mango Bowl Regatta will be held November 29-December 1.







#### FROM A BEACH IN BARBADOS HE ANTIGUA CLASSICS: THE JPERLATIVE SCHOONER RUTH



or over a decade, visitors to Barbados' Carlisle Bay watched with fascination as the 100ft schooner Ruth grew in size and shape. The keel was poured in 2003, followed by years of painstaking labour to create the hull, deck and rig. Amidst great fanfare, she was launched in 2014, making sailing history as the first steel schooner in the world to be built on a beach.

Years before and miles away, owner Ian Dash was given a model fishing schooner as a child, thinking one day he would like one of












his own. Later working in British Columbia on a 52ft lug rig fishing schooner designed by Naval Architect Tom Colvin, Dash learned first-hand about the ocean's wrath and a vessel that will tolerate it. In 1999 he sought the designer's services. "I wanted a fast work boat," he said. "Somehow, my idea of 80ft grew to 100 ft on Tom's table."


Moving to Barbados in 1983, Dash recruited talented craftsmen from Barbados, Guyana and the OECS. Based on Canada's Grand Banks schooners, the sails, blocks and hardware were all all handcrafted in Nova Scotia. Tying her linage together, stays were covered with New England pine tar and hatches oiled with Barbados beeswax. She represents the best of both maritime worlds.

As the project neared the end, the sustainable trading ship, Tres Hombres, sailed in. Two of their crew joined the Ruth project: Sean Parsonage was instrumental in replicating the traditional rig and Danielle Doggett became the launch captain and invaluable advisor on how to make Ruth pay for herself.













In 2017, on discovering they had a common dream, Dash engaged Gerrit Scheper, a 7th generation Barbadian schooner skipper, as *Ruth's* captain

Like her forebears, *Ruth* is a working girl. Together, owner and Captain are fine-tuning her mission, which envisions inter-island trade under sail to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and the installation of state of the art solar and wind electrical systems to minimise *Ruth*'s carbon footprint and to power her refrigeration systems. To meet the growing crew needs for sail-cargo ships, *Ruth* serves as teacher and classroom, offering Yacht Master training aboard and already, several Bajans have received their STCWs.

Supporters include the University of the West Indies, Barbados' Port Inc. and Global Affairs Canada/World University Service Canada, funding support for the solar-powered refrigeration. "When we're SOLAS compliant, we'll introduce trading between the Windward Islands, Guyana and Barbados," Dash said.

Adventure tourism is on the horizon for *Ruth* and already she served as Barbados's Sailing Ambassador during a hurricane relief mission to Anguilla in 2017. The Schooner's schedule last year included her first foray into racing at Antigua's Classic Yacht Regatta in April 2018, where she dazzled the competition both on and off the course. At the helm, Gerrit Scheper executed every tack with skill, rounding each mark with just feet to spare. Her team, small in number but big in force, took home prizes for their notable performance in the Sea Shanty Contest and Honourable Mention as Sailor of the Year went to young crew member, Nazz Alexander. Her return to the 2019 Antigua Classics is keenly anticipated.

Ruth's purpose is to serve by example. "By teaching and laying a pathway for others", Dash explained "using traditional rigging and simple but highly efficient skills that are cost effective, we can keep it alive." His passion for carrying the past into the future is infectious and will hopefully be followed by other classic sailing vessels to help close the shipping bottleneck between Caribbean islands.


# EAN LEGENDS: IVO

**CURAÇAO** BY ELS KROON



 $\boldsymbol{t}$  the end of every year the committed sailor, race director and judge for numerous years Ivo van Dooren gets into the spotlight as he is keeping a Agreat sailing tradition alive. On December 30 he organized his 35th End of the Year Race, a pursuit race that is said to be the most vibrant and challenging sailing event in Curacao.











During sailing regattas the attention is mostly focused on the races and the best performing sailing teams, but without a thorough preparation and guidance by an expert race director, timekeeper and accountant no race can take place. Ivo van Dooren is such a centipede. Various race and regatta organizations can count on him year after year for more than a quarter of a century.

For Van Dooren, the sailing sport only became an unmistakable part of his life after his arrival in Curação in 1979. The Dutch hydraulic engineer, born in Twente near the German border, left for Peru after completing his studies in the United States, where he volunteered to avoid compulsory military service. He put his knowledge straight into practice during the reconstruction after a catastrophic earthquake in the South American country. After the contract, he tried to find work again in South America, but ended up in Ghana, where he worked for a Dutch engineering firm in agriculture. His wanderings then led him via Suriname, where he worked as a bridge builder, to Curação where he chose domicile after six months, while working in Caracas. Soon he was asked to sail along with American friends, which led to the purchase of the Twente Ros a 23 foot Aguarius. This opened up the possibility to participate in regattas. "That's how I got involved in racing", Van Dooren reminisces. "In 1984 I was introduced by the late Kees Rademaker at Asiento Sailing Club, but only when



I became a member of the Donderlingen, a club of skilled sailors which still maintained a balloting at that time - I really learned to sail. The Donderlingen still exists, but the club is grayed up with an average age of no less than 68 years!" Van Dooren says with a hint of melancholy.

"And then the Bonaire Regatta, which experienced the 51st edition last year, came around. As long as I had the Twente Ros I competed myself, but after the sale of the boat, and the cancellation of the purchase of another boat, I was asked for the race committee and I liked it. There were complaints about the organization in the past, buoys were missing and it took forever before the results became known. I myself hate





disorganized activities, whether it is at work or in sport. With solution-oriented thinking we quickly realized improvements, also in dealing with protests. And there were new technical developments. For example, we clocked with the GPS. And the rating systems were further examined and updated. A great number of different factors need to be taken into account. Despite we try to do our best, the ratings remain a tricky issue. They are causing criticism among sailors who do not know the exact details, but they allow a diverse racing fleet to compete on an equal footing.

The use and application of the ratings is not the only task Van Dooren has performed through the years. His job starts with the creation of competition tracks and finding a suitable location. This used to be done on a map, but has now been replaced by GPS and Google Earth. "The weather conditions, speed of the participating boats and location have to be taken into account. Then sailing instructions must be drawn up, which nowadays require extra attention in the environmental field.

Every race requires at least 24 hours of preparation. "Too much work for a single person, that is why at the end of the eighties the CYA, the Curaçao Yachting Association was established, first unofficially, but now with its own regulations. Edwig Fontilus and Marc van Nes have been assisting with


the starts for several years. The organization however remains a challenge because it cannot cost anything.

"Before and during the actual race, buoys are laid and a start and finish are arranged, with sometimes a break moment - with an extra finish and start - to promote the fun and solidarity. And immediately afterwards the results must be calculated and protests handled. In between I follow the course of the race both on land and at sea. That's a lot of work but I'm happy to do so," Van Dooren enthusiastically admits. "Except for the speech at the prize-giving ceremony, it usually gives me headaches."

During each sailing race it's evident that Van Dooren volunteers and remains the stable and indispensable factor he has been in Curacao for 35 years, not only in the organizational field but also socially. His door is always open and he enjoys a solid international reputation as a reliable organizer and judge. He is also a board member of various sailing clubs and organizations on the island.

Van Dooren has recently been recognized and decorated by the Dutch King Willem Alexander as a Knight in the Order of Oranje Nassau, the crowning of his selfless dedication. Well deserved.

## CARIBBEAN RECIPES: GREEN MANGO SALAD

THE DISH BY CAP'N JAN ROBINSON

reen mangoes have numerous health benefits and an abundance of nutrition. Green Mango salad is one of my favorite dishes and definitely a favorite in Cambodia. Recipe below, is from Lily's Secret Garden Cooking Class, in Siem Reape.

As the green mango recipe also calls for cabbage, I thought I would add a little trivia. February, the 2nd month of the year brings us George Washington's Birthday, Valentine's Day, and the shortest month of the year. February in old English, was called Solmonath (Mud month) or Kale-monath (Kale or cabbage month.)

#### **GREEN MANGO SALAD**

Preparation time: 15 minutes. Serves: 4

SALAD:

1 green mango
1 shallot, finely sliced
1 large carrot, peel
and julienned
2 cups finely sliced
green cabbage
1/3 cup mint leaves,
torn and finely chopped
1 Tbsp. roasted sesame seeds
GARNISH: Curley Green Lettuce

1/2 cup fresh coriander, roughly chopped 1/4 cup unsalted roasted cashews or peanuts, roughly chopped 1/3 cup Vietnamese mint leaves or Basil, torn and finely chopped

#### SALAD DRESSING:

 small red chili, dressed, and minced
 clove garlic, minced
 Tbsp. fresh lime juice 2 tsp. honey 2 tsp. fish sauce 1 Tbsp. vegetable juice Kosher salt

Cut the mango from the stone. Peel and discard the skin, then coarsely grate the flesh. Put in a large bowl and add shallots, carrot, cabbage, mint, Vietnamese mint, coriander, and sesame seeds; toss all together. In a blender, purée the chili, garlic, lime juice, honey, fish sauce, and oil, until smooth. Pour over the grated mango mixture; toss and season with salt. Sprinkle with the cashews. Place garnish on plate, and Green Mango Salad on top.

NOTE: This salad should be fresh, crunchy, spicy, sour, and a little bit funky. Taste as you go and adjust to how you would like it!

HINT: The dressing maybe made the day before. Cover and refrigerate.



### SESAME SOBA NOODLE BOWL WITH EDAMAME

By Chef Jen Augspurger on Yacht S/C STARFISH

Preparation time: 5 minutes. Cooking time: 15 minutes. Serves: 2

6 oz. soba noodles
3 tsp. toasted sesame
oil, divided
8 scallions, whites and
part of the greens, minced
2 cups frozen shelled
edamame beans, thawed
and patted dry

GARNISH: Minced scallion greens

2 Tbsp. toasted black sesame seeds2 Tbsp. rice vinegar2 Tbsp. soy sauce1 Tbsp. toasted sesame oil1 tsp. minced ginger

Cook soba noodles according to package. Drain and toss with 1 teaspoon sesame oil. Over medium heat, add remaining 2 teaspoons sesame oil in a large pan. Add minced scallions, cooking for 3 to 4 minutes then add in the edamames. Cook, stirring occasionally, until edamames are hot and starting to char on a few pieces.

Whisk together the rice vinegar, soy sauce, sesame oil, and ginger. Pour over the noodles, followed by adding the toasted sesame seeds. Toss until everything is well coated and combined. Serve with extra soy sauce, sesame seeds, and minced scallion greens.

TIP: To toast sesame seeds, place in a dry skillet and cook over medium heat, stirring often, until sesame seeds are slightly fragrant, 3 to 4 minutes.


