RECORD-BREAKING DIVE IN THE BAHAMAS

Talk about a deep dive! On April 25, the Titan submersible broke a deep-sea diving record by transporting a crew of four on an abyssal descent to 12,336-feet (2.3 miles) approximately 10 nautical miles offshore of Great Abaco, Bahamas. The Titan was built by OceanGate, an Everett, Washington-based company that develops technologies and designs submersibles for underwater exploration and is the only craft of its kind capable of carrying a crew of five beyond 9800-feet.



"Through the innovative use of materials and technology, we are opening the ocean to human exploration," says Stockton Rush, OceanGate's founder and chief executive officer. "Titan is lighter in weight and carries more people than any other deep diving manned submersible making it cost effective to transport anywhere in the world and deploy from locally available vessels in turn making deep ocean exploration more accessible to researchers, scientists, and explorers."

Stockton adds that the Titan is the only manned submersible being used in the Caribbean for deep ocean exploration to depths of over 13,000 feet. Other manned submersibles capable of diving to this depth are government owned and/or not available for exploration expeditions. Stanley Submarines in Honduras and Substation Curacao have submersibles for tourism and custom projects at depths of less than 2000 feet. Long-term, OceanGate is developing expeditions around the globe, including the Caribbean, Mediterranean and South Pacific. www.oceangate.com

Nearly twenty sailors, racing Optimists, Lasers and RSFevas, competed in the BVI Dinghy Championships, hosted May 17 to 19 in Tortola by the Royal BVI Yacht Club. In the end, it was the Club itself that was a winner. Janet Oliver, executive director of the Charter Yacht Society of the BVI, presented a check in the amount of US \$1830 to help fund the Club's Youth Sailing Program.

"Apache is the ultimate ocean-going sailing vessel, unique

in its speed, comfort and safety, and an ideal platform on an incredible round the world voyage. This opportunity allows guests to sail with a fleet of boats in the World ARC, make lifelong sailing friends and visit remote destinations, many places only accessible by boat," says Apache's captain, Gerrit Scheper, a RYA/MCA Master of Yachts. Scheper is also a qualified RYA instructor, so expedition members can add expert training and 'mile building' to this bluewater experience.

The 13-leg World ARC rally starts in St Lucia in January 2020; taking crews across the Caribbean, through the Panama Canal, across the Pacific to Australia, the Indian Ocean to Cape Town, the Atlantic to Brazil then back up to the Caribbean. HE TRUE DANGER F CRUISING

SAILING HUMOR BY CAP'N FATTY GOODLANDER



he vast majority of coastal Earthlings do not know where the Caribbean is—let alone St. Thomas, Sint Maarten, or Grenada. As we circumnavigate, we tell curious locals that we are from an island close to Bob Marley's home—everyone in the Third World loves Brother Bob and knows where his Jamaican weed patch is located. I point this out because the Caribbean is its own homogeneous, fun-in-the-sun cruising microcosm—and hence, inward-looking. Once you get west of the Panama Canal, going foreign has a totally different meaning than island-hopping the Lesser Antilles.

Western culture fades—for better or worse.

Here's how we handle cruising abroad after nearly four decades of doing so.

First off, we never forget we're in a foreign country with dif-

ferent laws, rituals, religions, and social sensibilities. As an American, I have no difficulty 'standing on my rights' in any of the fifty States—but I've often found it a precarious perch while 15,000 ocean miles from my native Chicago.

Discretion is the better part of valor abroad.

The fact is—we are uninvited guests and we attempt to behave like it. The last thing we travel for is to tell the locals 'how we do it back home.' Instead, we travel to learn, not lecture. And a major part of learning is keeping your mouth shut.


Example: My wife Carolyn and I are devout Atheists. This doesn't translate in many primitive societies. They just keep asking which god you believe in. Thus we never mention religion while traveling ashore and, if pressed, mumble something about being raised "within the Christian culture."


Your average dockside lay-about in Hellville, Madagascar, sees no difference between Bill Gates and me in terms of income. To him, we are both fabulously wealthy. This is why we seldom talk dollars and cents while ashore in a village.

We constantly remind ourselves while circumnavigating that the people we meet—even those living in mud huts are just as smart as we are. Sure, they might have far less experience interacting with the rest of the world, less exposure to modern concepts, and far less education. But the tribal chief in Vanuatu, the plump farmer in Tonga, the respected headshrinker in Borneo, and the busy fisherman who supports his large family in Madagascar all rose to the top of their respective professions... while this humble marine scribe toils at the lower rungs (think income/food) of American society.

Sobering, eh?

If you want to travel-as-lifestyle, pack your humility. Even better, leave your paranoia home. Karma is tricky-even dangerous. In Fort de France we met a grumpy Austrian sailor on a Bruce Roberts steel cutter who, perhaps, should have

Instead, we say things like, "Our home cost us three years of combined hard labor—how much time did it take for you to earn your house?"

Remember, individuals think their daily experience is reality—when it is only a tiny slice. This applies equally to the most sophisticated Parisian as it does to the most primitive Melanesian. Thus, when we were in Tanna, Vanuatu—where every home steam-cooks from the furnace of their volcano—and they learned that people in NYC didn't have a free volcano to heat their food with, they immediately and graciously offered to cook the food on Tanna and send it to the less fortunate residents of the Big Apple. (No, their sense of geography or the economics of global shipping isn't perfect—but that doesn't stop them from being sweet.)

Each time we parted, the locals would look us sincerely in the eye and say, "I love you too much!"

Perhaps my wife Carolyn puts it best. "When I was young I wanted to surround myself with highly intelligent people—now I value kindness more."

Integrity has no price tag.

only plied familiar waters. He wasn't having a good time in the Lesser Antilles. "It scares me being in a country where I don't know the language," he told us a number of times. "What happens if something strange occurs—you get hit with a ton of bricks—and end up separated from your boat in the hospital?"

He must have used this 'ton of bricks' reference to us a dozen times to us—which later made us blanch when we'd heard he'd been struck by a truck carrying cinder blocks near St. Anne's.

Yikes!

Part of the problem in the Third World is money and its perception. Your average dockside lay-about in Hellville, MadaRespect in foreign ports must be earned.

And we have to remind ourselves repeatedly that our culture blinkers us as much as theirs.

In Madagascar, we met a family who wanted used (not working) cassette tapes—so that they could dig up their dead relatives and decorate their bones (with bows; they couldn't afford ribbons) to ensure their family's continued good luck.

Strange? I dunno—they seemed relatively lucky to us.

On Tanna, status is a tad different from you'd expect. For instance, the 'pig man' is held in high esteem, like a combination banker and preacher. They are so primitive in parts

of Vanuatu that the male hunters don't wear clothes, just 'nambas' (sheaths) covering their penis.

Yes, cultural flexibility is the key to foreign travel. Let's face it there is a certain negative chauvinism in the term 'going native' isn't there? I once met an uptight Aussie sailor in Cocos Keeling who, eight weeks into his circumnavigation, irritably assured me his 'standards' had not dropped while cruising as if our Western standards were, of course, far superior to the piddling standards of others.

I'm not sure—especially in light of a warming planet.

After all, the aborigines of Australia managed their island's ecology for thousands of years without a problem—look at what the just-arrived Westerners have done to destroy it within a few short years.

Actually, come to think of it, 'changing my standards' is ex-


actly why I'm a serial circumnavigator. (This 'superior' dude sold his boat in Cape Town, claiming she was too expensive to maintain.)

And that's the real beauty—and true ter-0 ror-of 'going foreign.'







NOTHING BETTER THAN A SHOWER AT THE END OF DAY IN THE SEA


hen I first bought Guiding Light almost 10 years ago, it was a 4 cabin/4 head Lagoon 410. In order to take a shower, you basically sat on the toilet and pulled the sink faucet out and used it as a shower head. As soon as I moved aboard, I decided that I did not want to sit on a toilet every time I wanted to take a shower and then deal with the floor being wet if I need to go the bathroom. So, I removed the toilet and sawzalled the sink away in the port aft cabin. This left me with a nice big space for a shower that already had a drain and sump pump. All I had to do was add a shower head and handles and then add a sheet of white plastic as a wall. It actually looked pretty good and worked well.

I only had hot water when I ran the engine. Also, it took an entire shower before the hot water finally got to the shower (on charter I always told the moms to let the kids go first, hehe).

When I replaced my engines this off season, I chose to toss the old hot water heater. I did this because it was 21 years old, falling apart, hooked up to the old engine, and on the opposite side of the boat. I decided that I did not really like having the hot water run through the engine cooling system, because this meant I only had hot water when I ran the engine. Also, it took an entire shower before the hot water finally got to the shower (on charter I always told the moms to let the kids go first, hehe).

After much research and testing I chose to have a 160-watt 12-volt solar panel wired directly to a home hot water tank. The solar panel was able to power the heating element in the tank without a regulator, except for the thermostat in the hot water tank itself. For the hot water tank I chose a German made four gallon Stiebel Eltron I found at Home Depot due to the size and how well it looked. I also replaced my old two handle shower faucet with a new scald guard, mixing faucet required in new homes.

The first order of business was to tear out all the original improvements and get the shower back to the bare side wall. I then used 5/8-inch plastic boards I found at Home Depot, that measured two foot by four foot, to frame out where the hot water heater and faucet handle would be located.







For the hot water heater, I built a shelf for it to sit on and then a backing board to mount it to. This way all the weight was on the platform and not the mounting board.

Once all this was in place, I used the two-foot by four-foot boards as wall paneling instead of one giant sheet like before. Oh, my goodness did this make a huge difference in the ease of getting it mounted. Where the joint between the boards would flex, I took a long piece of scrap board and screwed it onto the lower part of the back of one of the boards with some hangover. Once the next board was in place, I screwed it into this overlap and it pulled the joint tight. To finish the shower, I stained and sealed some small trim, put little plastic screw covers in place, caulked each joint, and then recaulked the shower pan.

Of course, as my best friend, who helped so much in the research stage, says "no job will be successful unless there is the letting of blood." Therefore, it should come as no surprise that the shower is working great, because I had several decent cuts by the time I was done, Haha.

In the end the solar panel heats up the water even on cloudy days to a comfortable level and on sunny days you can only turn the hot water on a little bit. The best part is that the hot water is there within the time it takes you to wet your hair, due to the short distance it has to travel. As Hannibal Smith of the A-Team would say, "I love it when a plan comes together!" 🕢

owboats, tree trunk crafted rafts, papyrus reed-built sailboats, outboards and RIBs (rigid inflatable boat) are among the vessels that adventurous seafarers have employed in modern times to successfully cross the Atlantic Ocean. As of May, add a wooden barrel to this list. More specifically, on May 4, 72-year-old Frenchman Jean-Jacques Savin stepped ashore in St. Eustatius after leaving the Canary Islands on December 26, 2018. Savin traveled 3,125 nautical miles in 127 days in a 10-foot-long plywoodbuilt barrel.

"I have cherished the sea since my early childhood," says Savin, a former military paratrooper and park ranger in Africa. "When my daughter, Manon, was born we went sailing for 7 years."


Savin, an experienced navigator, has crossed the Atlantic





four times already aboard a conventional sailboat. He is also no stranger to extreme physical challenges. The Frenchman has swum across the Arcachon Bay on France's Atlantic Coast, hiked Mont Blanc, the tallest mountain in the Alps at over 15,000 feet and swam, ran and biked his way to a second-place finish just two years ago in the French Triath-Ion Championships. However, the idea to use only wind and currents to cross the Atlantic in an engine-less, sail-less bar-

rel came from an incredible 1950s tale. So, as the story goes, a young French doctor and biologist named Alain Bombard left the Canaries on a rubber raft bound for Barbados in conditions that simulated a shipwreck. Bombard's success proved it was possible to survive on natural resources like fish to eat. Savin was captivated with the story and wanted to accomplish a similar feat in the 21st century. But first, there was a barrel to build.



Savin constructed the 10-foot long, 7-foot wide barrel, with only 65-square feet of living space inside, in a small shipyard in his native Ares, France. The outer layer of the safety orange painted barrel was made of a resin-coated plywood that he reinforced to protect against cracks by whale attacks and big waves. There are four portholes: one on each side, one under the hull, which was ideal for watching fish and other sea life, and one in the top hatch opening. The 24-inch hatch is protected by a clear bubble-like covering that protects against the elements while offering a peek out at the sea beyond. A weighted keel balanced the barrel. Inside, Savin outfitted the cozy interior with a small wood plank bed and opposite that a stove for cooking. Two 100W solar panels provided power so that he could connect to satellite and provide some 23,000 Facebook followers regular updates throughout his voyage. Safety equipment included a life jacket, lift raft, fire extinguisher and personal distress beacon. Last, but not least, Savin packed a block of foie gras and small bottle of wine to ring in the New Year and celebrate his 72nd birthday on January 14.

"The most exhilarating part of the trip was the refueling with food on the 85th day by the American oceanographic (NOAA) ship, the Ronald Brown. The most difficult moment was the close approach of a cargo vessel. I didn't have a radio, so I sent up a smoke signal using a flare in order to be spotted. We missed each other by about 50 feet," Savin explains.

Another moment that proved more harrowing than happy at first was Savin's approach to St. Eustatius. There was a strong wind and he feared crashing on the reefs. The U.S. Coast Guard had him on their radar, literally and figuratively, in case he needed assistance. Ultimately, the nearby tanker, the Kelly Anne, rendezvoused with Savin, hoisted his barrel to the safety of their ship and took him aboard for a meal, shower and the final distance to dry land.


One of the first people to welcome Savin to the Caribbean was Ingrid Walther, one of the owners of the Scubaqua Dive Center in St. Eustatius.

"As soon as he touched land I just squeezed him in my arms and congratulated him," says Walther. "It was really moving and he was so happy to speak French again. The tanker crew were only English-speaking, so he did not get a chance to share a lot with them as his English is very basic. We helped him with Customs and Immigration, found a free hotel room for him at the Old Gin House, welcomed him into our dive center to get Internet so he could let his friends in France know he was fine. We also invited him home for dinner to enjoy a Swiss cheese raclette, knowing he did not get a chance to have a proper meal during the past months."

Walther adds, "Most people probably did not take Jean-Jacques seriously before his adventure, but he did it! I think we all need to meet people like him, who are simply different from most of us and live a passionate life far different from ours. They manage to reach a total freedom away from the society and its living rules!"

Savin traveled next to Martinique where he arranged for the barrel to be shipped on a cargo vessel back to France, where it will be on display in a number of exhibitions. He flew back home too in mid-May.








10 TOP CARIBBEAN CAVES TO SPELUNK

xploration above as well as under-the-sea is spectacular. Ditto on land. The Caribbean islands are resplendent with scenic mountain summits as well as riddled with spectacular cave systems. Many caves are open to the public via private tour. Visiting the subterranean world is a delightfully cool way to enjoy a hot Caribbean day.

1. GREEN GROTTO CAVES, JAMAICA.

Green Grotto Caves - Jamaica

Named for the algae that covers the walls, this popular natural attraction was one of the film locations for James Bond's Live and Let Die. Inside, and part of the guided tour, is an underground lake, several chambers where Amerindians once lived and later escaped slaves hid, and remnants of a night-club from the 1980's, complete with dance floor and concrete benches. Located 45 miles from Montego Bay. *greengrotto cavesja.com*

2. CRYSTAL CAVES, CAYMAN ISLANDS.

See three caves on one tour. Located in a tropical forest setting outside the village of Northside, Grand Cayman, a 1.5-hour tour of Crystal Caves takes you through an open-ceiling cave, a roots cave and a lake cave. A nature walk after emerging from underground is a great place to see air plants and parrots. Guided tours take place on the top of the hour between 9 a.m. and 4 p.m. www.caymancrystalcaves.com




3. CUEVA DE LAS MARAVILLAS, DOMINICAN REPUBLIC.


It's not called the 'Cave of Wonders' for nothing. In fact, one of the most spectacular marvels are the 500-plus excellently preserved Amerindian petroglyphs etched on the walls and dating back several millennia. Located 6 miles west of La Romana within a National Park, guided tours last about 35 minutes. An installed lighting system shadows bouncing off the stalactites and stalagmites look otherworldly. There is an elevator for those unable to walk down into the cave, located 80-feet underground. www.godominicanrepublic. com/caving

4. CONCH BAR CAVES, TURKS AND CAICOS.


No drinks are served at this Bar, but there are plenty of sights to drink in at this largest non-submerged cave system in the island nation that's open to the public. Located on Middle Caicos, the caves have been home to Amerindians prior to Columbus arrival as well as to bats. Guano (bat poo) was mined from here for export as an agricultural fertilizer. Be sure to reserve a one-hour guided tour in advance of your visit. www.visittci.com/conch-bar-caves

5. THE BATHS, BRITISH VIRGIN ISLANDS. While not true caves, it's definitely fun to swim and explore through the cavernous grottos formed between the gigantic granite boulders that top the beach on the southern end of Virgin Gorda. No tour guide needed. The Baths are part of the BVI National Parks Trust and as such the trails here are well marked. There is also a restaurant and bathrooms nearby. www.bvitourism.com/baths-national-park




6. HARRISON'S CAVE, BARBADOS.

Named for Thomas Harrison, who discovered the cave on his land back in the 1700's, it took three more centuries for this now popular attraction to be officially opened to the public. Spelunking is easy here. There's a 1-hour narrated tram tour that travels through much of the 1.4-mile cave system, which includes the 50-foot high great hall, several streams and waterfalls. There's also a 3.5-hour Eco-Adventure Tour that includes helmets, head lamps and knee guards to get a close up look at some of the cave's natural passages.

7. NORMAN ISLAND CAVES, **BRITISH VIRGIN ISLANDS.**

The 600-acre uninhabited Norman Island, located across the Sir Francis Drake Channel from Tortola, is said to be the inspiration for famed author Robert Louis Stevenson's book, Treasure Island. Where the treasure is nobody knows for sure, but plenty of local lore says gold doubloons may be found in one or spread among all of the three sea-level caves located at Treasure Point in Privateer Bay. These caves are popular to snorkel because you can swim in and out. Even if there's no booty, there is plenty of marine life to see. www.bvitourism.com/other-islands





8. QUADIRIKIRI CAVE, ARUBA.

Located within Arikok National Park, towards the middle of the island, Quadirikiri is best known for its distinctive two chambers. Both are spotlighted by natural sunlight shining through holes in the cave's roof. Darker portions of the 100-foot long cave are where hundreds of bats nest. Park rangers at the entrance to the cave are available for tours and visitor questions. www.arubanationalpark.org


9. HATO CAVES, CURACAO.

These coral limestone caves, formed over millions of years in a series of layers and terraces, are huge. Specifically, 790 feet long and some 53,000-square feet in area. This makes the caves a big tourist attraction. There's a 45-minute tour, where you'll hear the cave's history and stories of stalactites and stalagmites shaped to give them names like Mother Teresa, the Sea Tortoise and Sleeping Giant. Rare bats are often seen just hanging around. curacaohatocaves.com




10. BLACK HOLE DROP, BELIZE.

One of the best extreme 'caving' trips is in the Caribbean's west coast country of Belize and it's actually a sinkhole. The professionally led day-long tour starts with an hour-plus steep hike up Maya Mountains to the mouth of the cave. Actun Loch Tunich is nicknamed the 'Mother of all Caves' for good reason. Exploration requires rappelling into the basin of the sinkhole, some 300 feet below in the dark. www.travelbelize.org/things-to-do/activities/caving








here's nothing like a place to call home. Especially, when you're cruising away from home. Many marinas throughout the Caribbean offer opportunities to dock your yacht for a season, annually or longer. The biggest advantage of having a permanent slip, is that you can consider the assigned berth your 'homeport' in whatever island you chose, even in peak season when marinas could potentially have little or no availability. The disadvantage is potentially limiting yourself to one geographic area. Yet this is easily solved by choosing that location wisely. That is, consider the services, amenities and recreational activities at the marina and its neighboring environs and match them up to your life and cruising style.

There are two ways to obtain a slip of your own. One is to buy and the second, which is much more prevalent, is to lease.

Christophe Harbour is a good example of the former. The



2,500-acre resort and superyacht marina located on the southeastern peninsula of St. Kitts launched the sale last year of the region's only freehold superyacht berths for vessels from 350- to 400-feet. According to Aeneas Hollins, director of yachting, the new superyacht berths are being offered for sale with deeded, freehold title and range in price from US \$6.25 to US \$7 million.

IGY Marinas are one of several marine properties that exemplifies the latter.

"All of our locations offer seasonal and annual slip leasing options," says Key Mellinger, sales and marketing manager for the Fort Lauderdale, Florida-based company that operates marinas in the Turks & Caicos, St. Thomas, St. Maarten and St. Lucia, as well as on the Caribbean sea side of Columbia and Panama. "These are typically for durations of 4- to 12-months with renewal options at the end of the term. We do have locations that offer long-term leasing options which allow vessel owners to purchase a slip lease for anywhere between 5- to 15-years depending on what best suits their specific needs and use of the vessel."


Similarly, berths are available at Camper & Nicholsons' Port Louis Marina in Grenada on a lease basis for periods of 3- to 35-years for vessels between 40- and 300-feet in length.


"Initially, we would provide a simple guide to the lease and suggest a visit to the marina. This would incorporate viewing what is available on the marina and discussing the owner's requirements and how we can best assist," says Glynn Thomas, general manager. Thomas adds that leases are for specific slips rather than general dockage, and that a standard lease can be completed in a matter of weeks.

There are definite advantages of an annual lease.

"Year-round customers receive a lower rate on their slip's monthly rent in appreciation of their long-term commitment. Long term lease holders also receive additional benefits when it comes to pricing in our boatyard and hurricane plans," says Carlos Ponce, sales and customer service manager at Puerto del Rey Marina, in Fajardo, Puerto Rico.

Customers with an annual contract at Jolly Harbour Marina in Antigua receive unlimited dockage within the marina and storage in the boatyard during the summer season. This contract also includes one haul, launch, pressure wash and chocking package, according to Jo Lucas, general manager of Eastern Caribbean Marina & Boatyard Ltd., which owns the marina. "This proves to be a great option

if an owner is coming and going through the year to use the vessel."

A disadvantage of an extended stay commitment is the slip must be paid for whether the vessel is in the slip or not.

"Seasonal agreements are priced at a different rate, but also offer more flexibility on the lease with a minimum requirement of 3 months or more," says Puerto del Rey's Ponce.

The third way to get a slip to call home is as a land and sea combination. One of the latest of these opportunities is underway in Antigua.

"In partnership with The Inn at English Harbour, we have launched Admiralty Residential Development, an exclusive marina residential development project which allows motor and sailing yacht owners to own a condo or timeshare unit with the possibility of leasing a dock space," explains Roberto Falangola, managing director of Antigua Slipway Ltd. "The development consists of 8 to10 units, with an option of two or three-bedrooms on 4.18 sea view acres in English Harbour, Antigua. The property uniquely overlooks the historic Nelson's Dockyard, English Harbour




and Falmouth Harbour with a comfortable 5-minute walk to Antigua Slipway Ltd."

The Blue Lagoon Hotel & Marina is also expanding, according to owner, Kelly Glass. "I am developing 4-acres across the water in The Blue Lagoon. We are building another marina where slips could be sold in combination with a condo or hotel suite on land."

In the end, Puerto Del Rey's Ponce says it best: "There are countless advantages to having a slip in the Caribbean! The great weather, numerous islands to explore and cultural diversity makes everyone feel they belong to a special place."


tend to avoid popular anchorages and big towns, instead we anchor mostly in remote bays or next to little villages. Hitchhiking's a great way to get to talk to people and to make new friends. Quite often the locals in such areas are still genuinely interested in meeting people from far-away countries and we've experienced some fabulous hospitality. Villagers that would be considered poor by western standards have sent us off loaded with bags of fruit from their gardens or even opened their humble homes for us and made us join the family meal. Faced with such generosity we still find it hard not to cringe when we encounter mountain-high cultural barriers chatting with them. How to react when they cook tiny lobsters for dinner? What to say when they proudly present their ten kids in an overpopulated country? What to do about the batteries on the rubbish pile behind the house?



People understandably don't enjoy being lectured by knowit-all outsiders and proudly refer to their traditions when













questioned about such issues. Of course traditional cultures worked well over long periods of time. E.g., archaic sounding taboos on places and animals were in fact a well-considered tool that ensured a sustainable lifestyle by keeping the hunters/gatherers from taking too many or too small specimen. Unfortunately tradition often fails when confronted with modern problems. Biodegradable rubbish was tossed into lagoons since people got there, but as soon as plastic entered the scene everything changed. Many cultures also have lost a great part of their traditional knowledge under the influence of colonial powers, missionaries, etc. and are now lost in a limbo between their old culture and the modern influence. Others retain a mixture of half-remembered traditions and superstitions. They stubbornly refuse newfangled ideas like contraception and recycling while happily embracing convenient gadgets like outboard engines and smartphones.




Take pictures when the creature is butchered and enjoy watching the action?
















Quickly walk by and try not to interfere with the local customs? Confront the person in charge and start a discussion about the need to protect endangered species?



CHAIRMAN'S RESERVE -SAINT LUCIA

ur monthly rum selection is typically driven by a recommendations, sipping vs. mixing or even price point. This month we decided to go to the island of Saint Lucia where the Pitons mountains play backdrop to lush rainforest and crystal white beaches. It's also home to Saint Lucia Distillers' Chairman's Reserve.

Sugar plantations began dotting Saint Lucia's countryside in the late 1700s. Many produced rum from molasses for the indentured help brought in to tend the crops. Sugar production soared until the European sugar beets market took hold, significantly reducing the export

of sugar to Europe. By the 1950s there were only two distillers left – Geest, the Dutch banana company and the Barnard family, who had been producing rum since 1932. In 1972 the two formed a joint venture, consolidating their operations on Geest's land in Roseau Valley. The Barnard family bought out Geest in 1992 selling those shares to Angostura, Ltd in 1996.

Today, Saint Lucia Distillers Group of Companies remains at Roseau Valley producing over 25 rums from premium sipping to specialty rums.

All of Saint Lucia Distillers' rums begin with molasses imported from Guyana, fermented for 24-30 hours then either pot or column distilled depending on the product. The rums are then aged for a period of time depending on the type of rum to be produced. Chairman's Reserve is a blend of aged rums of both Coffey column stills and copper pot stills. After they have aged separately in ex-bourbon barrels they are then blended and rested in oak vats for a period of six months. The average age of the rum is five years.

HE SAID

After the rum is allowed to breathe, I find notes of oak, vanilla, caramel and orange providing a sweet nose. The first sip



is a burst of cloves which quickly gives way to molasses and oak. This rum is interesting because with each sip the cloves say, "Hey I'm here but look who else I brought to the party." I pick up vanilla, orange and raisins. The finish is smooth with vanilla, tobacco and oak.

SHE SAID

The rum is a rich golden amber producing deep lacing on the glass. I agree with Clint that the rum needs to breathe a bit before enjoying. My nose picks up banana, orange and an undertone of molasses. The initial sip engulfs my senses with a strong alcohol burn followed by a burst of cloves with the finish burning before warming. The second sip is much more inviting with

the orange and banana taking the lead followed by tobacco. The finish also settles with almost a spicy chocolate note.

OVERALL

Let Chairman's Reserve sit and breathe and take your time contemplating before passing judgement. While not rich with multiple notes this rum is a keeper to enjoy with company or with a plate of brownies.

KIBBLAN RECIPES:

THE DISH BY CAP'N JAN ROBINSON

here are spiny lobsters and there are Maine lobsters; both are caught year round. There is no need to pay big dollars for lobster at a fancy restaurant when they are easy to prepare at home.

BOILED LOBSTER

Prep time: 30 minutes. Cooking time: 15 minutes. Serves: 2

3 gallons water 2 onions peeled and coarsely chopped 10 garlic cloves, peeled and chopped in half 2 lemons, cut in quarters 2 oranges, cut in quarters 6 stalks celery, cut in quarters 3 Tbsp. freshly ground black pepper 3 Tbsp. coarse sea salt 2 (11/2 lbs.) fresh live lobsters

Pour the water into a large pot and add the onions, garlic, lemons, oranges, celery, black pepper, and salt. Bring to a full rolling boil and boil for 20 minutes. Add the lobsters and place a lid over the pot. Boil for 15 minutes. Remove the lobsters from the pot, and place in a colander under cool running water to stop the cooking. Serve.

HINT: You can cook more lobsters in broth, but only two at a time.

LOBSTER BISQUE

Prep time: 30 minutes. Cooking time: 30 minutes. Serves: 4

2 Tbsp. olive oil 1 medium onion, chopped 2 garlic cloves, minced 3/4 tsp. paprika 1/4 cup dry Sherry (not Sherry cooking wine)

1 cup canned diced tomatoes 1 cup fat free, low-sodium

chicken broth

GARNISH: chopped green onions

1 cup plain almond milk 2 (4 oz.) lobster tails 1/2 Tbsp. cornstarch Lemon juice Sea Salt Freshly ground black pepper, to taste Tabasco sauce, to taste

Heat a large heavy bottomed Dutch oven over medium heat. Once hot, add a little olive oil. Sauté onion, garlic and paprika until tender about 2 minutes. Add wine and cook until it has reduced about one half, about 2 minutes. Add tomatoes and their juice. Reduce slightly. Add chicken broth and 3/4 cup milk and bring to a boil. Reduce the heat and let simmer about 20 minutes. The soup should reduce about one-half. Turn off the heat and let cool slightly.

Remove the lobster meat from the tails and cut into pieces. Working in batches, pour soup into blender and pulse until smooth. Then strain through a fine mesh strainer and return to pot. Whisk together



remaining milk, and cornstarch. Add to soup mixture. Turn up heat; bring back to a boil whisking constantly. Once hot, reduce heat to medium-low. Add uncooked lobster and let cook about 3 minutes. Season with lemon juice, salt, pepper, and Tabasco. Garnish and serve.

LOBSTER NIÇOISE SALAD

Prep time: 30 minutes. Cooking time: 1 hour 15 minutes. Serves: 6

3 (1½-lb.) live lobsters 1 lb. small new potatoes, cut in half

4 cups mixed baby salad greens or arugula

1 lb. green beans, trimmed 1 pint cherry tomatoes, halved 1/2 cup Niçoise olives or other black olives

DRESSING:

2 anchovy fillets, chopped 1/8 tsp. sea salt Freshly ground pepper to taste

2 tsp. grated lemon zest

1/4 cup lemon juice 3 tablespoons finely chopped fresh chives 1/2 cup extra-virgin olive oil

Bring 6 inches of water to a rolling boil in a very large pot. Add lobsters, claw-side down; cover and cook about 15 minutes. Remove lobster from the pot. Run under cool water to stop cooking and be able to handle. Remove the tail and claws from the body. Cut open the tail and pull out all the meat. Crack open the claws and remove the meat.

Using a large pot fitted with a steamer basket, bring 1 inch of water to a boil. Add potatoes, cover and cook until tender, about 15 minutes. Remove to cool. Add more water to pot, if necessary. Add green beans to the steamer basket; cover and cook until bright green and just tender, about 5 minutes. Drain and run under cool water, then drain thoroughly.

Mash anchovies and salt in a medium bowl using the back of a spoon. Stir in pepper, lemon zest, lemon juice and chives. Whisk in oil in a slow steady stream until well combined.

Arrange greens on a serving platter. Top with the lobster meat, potatoes, green beans, tomatoes and olives; spoon ¼ cup of vinaigrette over the top. Serve remaining on the side.
