WOMEN'S MENTORSHIP PROGRAM LAUNCHES IN ANTIGUA AND BARBUDA

Getting more women into the sport and industry of sailing is the goal of a new mentorship program spearheaded by Antigua Sailing Week (ASW), the Antigua and Barbuda Sailing Association (ABSA) and the Antigua and Barbuda Marine Association (ABMA). It's a program right on-trend and follows





the continued focus from global organizations on promoting gender equality.

"The program focuses on performance sailing and although eventually we would love to see more women in racing, we decided that our program needed to be broadened to include recreational sailing and additionally to invite women into the industry," says Alison Sly-Adams, ASW president. So first, we will determine individually what the women are interested in and then we will design the program around that. The key thing is that we will be using our contacts and network to open doors for the women. That may well be literally learning to sail which would take place at the National Sailing Academy, or if one of the women aspires to be a pilot in St John's Harbour, we would build links with the port and the department of marine services and merchant shipping so she can understand the requirements."

Eight mentees from ages 16 to 30 will participate in the program's first edition. Over the next year, these women will have four one-to-one sessions with a mentor and two team days with mentors and mentees together as part of ASW.

Mentors for this first year are Eloise Green, Super Yacht Services professional; Rana Jamila-Lewis, lifelong recreational sailor, day skipper and Events and Marketing Manager of ASW; Paola Vittoria, lifelong sailor and organizer of

the World Optimist Championship held in Antigua in 2019; Elizabeth Jordan, founder of the National Sailing Academy; Junella King, sailing instructor, dockmaster and day skipper; Samara 'Nicky' Emmanuel one of Team Antigua Island Girls and a freelance skipper and delivery and race crew; Susan Elliott-Beatty, Class Secretary of the International Optimist Dinghy Association and secretary of ABSA; and Sly-Adams, who is also president of the Caribbean Sailing Association and General Manager of the National Sailing Academy. www.sailingweek.com/mentorship

WORLD SAILING APPROVES INTERNATIONAL **RS21 CLASS ASSOCIATION**



It's official! The Equipment Committee members of World Sailing, the global governing body for the sport of sailing, voted unanimously in May to approve the RS21 International Class Association. This means the RS21 Class can host several international level, World Sailing-endorsed events, including World Championships.

The RS21 is a modern-style 21-footlong keelboat with a 7-foot beam, 695-square-foot sail area, capacity for 2 to 6 crew collectively weighting 265 to 1000 pounds. The powerful rig and distinct chines are balanced by well-

mannered boat handling and an ergonomic deck layout to ensure everyone sailing has a key role to play. The retail price starts at US \$36,000.

With RS21 fleets now established in countries including the United Kingdom, Italy, Norway, Germany, Poland, USA, Bermuda and Australia as well as fleet development projects well underway in other parts of the world such as the Middle East, Central and South America, and Asia, the next couple of years will no doubt see a large growth of the class in all continental regions. This growth is poised to include the Caribbean too as there are to date three RS brand ambassadors in the Caribbean: BVI Water Sports in Tortola, Beach Addiction in St. Kitts & Nevis, and L.M. Watersports in Antigua & Barbuda.

NEW HOOK PROMISES TO HELP FISH SURVIVE CATCH-AND-RELEASE

Conservation-conscious anglers practice catch-and-release especially for species of fish that are caught for recreational fun rather than as food. The problem is that some fish don't survive as human handling to remove the hook and exposure to air can impact health and ultimately the finned critter's mortality. Now, a new 'bite-shortened' hook designed by researchers with the University of Florida (UF), the U.S. Department of Agriculture and U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service enables anglers to successfully catch and release fish without direct contact. This

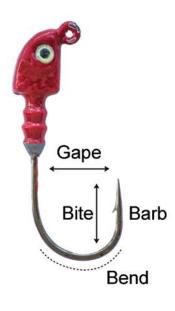

hook is basically a circle hook modified to have a shorter point or 'bite'.

"We tested the bite-shortened hook with a popular coastal sport fish, Spotted Seatrout. The results were promising in our study done with this species, but we can't report results for any other species," says Holden Earl Harris, PhD, postdoctoral research associate at the UF's Nature Coast Biological Station on Cedar Key. "Our hope is that our study will be replicated with other species where anglers target highly valued and at-risk species—such as tarpon, bonefish, peacock bass, taimen, tunas, and billfish. Such research appears warranted given the continuing rise in worldwide recreational fishing and our improving understanding of discard effects in fisheries. With further study and application, self-releasing hooks could provide novel management approaches and fishing best practices to optimize the tradeoffs between allowing fishing opportunities and conserving fish populations."

The bite-shortened hook can be fashioned at home and with simple tools. Researchers made the bite-shortened hooks from standard hooks—3.5 g (1/8 oz) jig heads ("Offshore AnglerTM Deluxe Standup") with a 15 mm bite distance—by cutting off the barbed portion of the hook with wire cutters to shorten the bite distance to 10 mm, and then sharpening the end at the cut-off point with the dermal grinder. EIGHT BELLS: PETER HAYCRAF

Peter, an Englishman from Worthing in Sussex, passed away peacefully at home in Tortola on the 29th May, 2021.

He became a master mariner at a young age and in 1960, and recently married, he decided to move to the British Virgin Islands. He quickly found work as a boat and ferry captain and before long he identified the demand for imported food and a retail grocery business. Road Town Wholesale Ltd was born.

In 1967 the need for his own vessel for reliable shipping to the BVI became paramount so the company bought an old 60-ft wooden cargo boat, the MV Kilros in the UK and motored it across the Atlantic, a challenging feat at the time.

Over the following 50 years the company expanded to five supermarkets and in 1986 a shipping business, Island Shipping, was incorporated.

Peter's passion was always sailing and the sea. His own yacht, Pipedream, was often at the head of the leaderboard in local regattas throughout the Caribbean. He was influential in creating the annual BVI Spring Regatta which remains one of the foremost regattas in the region today. He was elected Commodore of the Royal BVI Yacht Club no less than thirteen times.

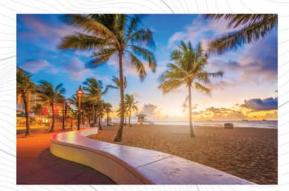
One of Haycraft's enduring character traits was his philanthropy. Always eager to promote sailing in the BVI's youth he helped provide equipment and expenses for promising youngsters to partake in the sport and take part in events. After the devastating hurricanes of 2017 he contributed substantial funding to the rebuilding of the Enis Adams Primary School into a modern and state-of-the-art facility.

In 2020 Peter was awarded an OBE by Her Majesty the Queen for services to the British Virgin Islands.

Peter and his wife Penny made the BVI their home from 1960, raised three children and enjoyed 62 years of 0 married life. He is survived by Penny, son Chris and daughters Susan and Julie.

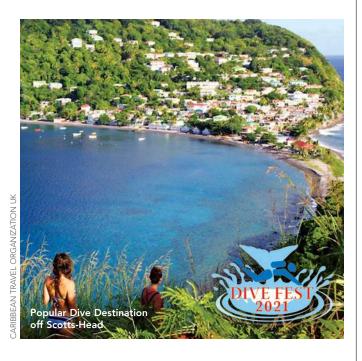
JULY 3: Firecracker 500.

Details were still being finalized as of late May, yet this event will happen and once again be hosted out of the Grand Caribe Belize resort on Ambergris Cay. Prize-worthy species for catch-and-release include blue marlin, white marlin, sailfish and spearfish, as well as the heaviest dolphin (mahimahi), tuna, kingfish and barracuda. The Grand Caribe resort is home to the only International Game Fishing Association (IGFA) approved weigh station in Belize. What draws fishing fanatics here for the tournament as well as year-round is the region's longest coral reef located only a few miles offshore where over 500 species of fish swim and live among the flats and lagoons. www.grandcaribebelize.com

The famous four-day circumnavigation of Martinique aboard the island's traditional vessel, a yole, is still set to take place, according to organizers who met in mid-May. First held in 1966, the event was revived in 1985 and recast in its current format: sail by day and party each evening in four different venues as sailors navigate around the island. Noteworthy is that the Martinican yole was included in UNESCO's Intangible Cultural Heritage List for the first time in December 2020.



This fast, light, shallow-draught boat powered by one or two brightly colored rectangularly-shaped sails was a key tool of the islander's old-time fishing trade. This year, the yoles must cross the start line in the open sea rather than closer to shore. 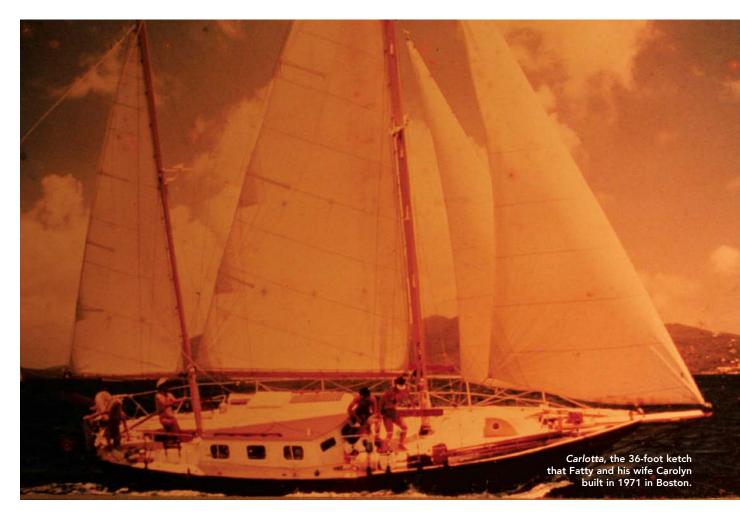






ARLY SAILING STARS, ACK IN THE DAY

CRUISING BY CAP'N FATTY GOODLANDER

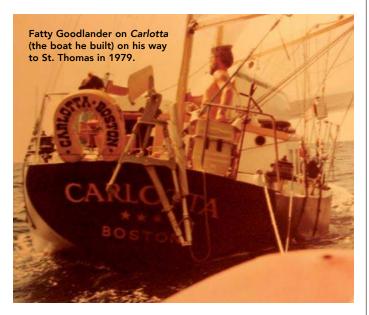


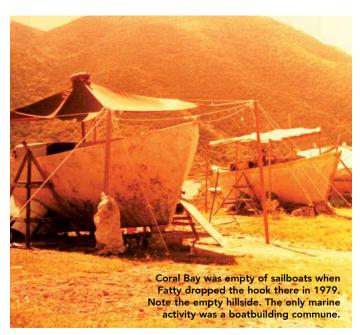
ince I grew up aboard, it was always a given that someday I'd circumnavigate—but there was 'many a slip between the cup and lip' as they say. My first boat rotted faster than I could wood-butcher new planks and frames into her. It took me a while to build a new 36-foot ketch from scratch with empty pockets. Thus, I was in my midtwenties in the late '70s before heading down to the Lesser Antilles for a brief shakedown cruise before shoving off on my first circ.

Luckily, in the Bahamas I met a cowboy bullrider from Texas named Fritz on a heavily-damaged boat called Tumbleweed. He claimed to have been just rescued by the USCG Cutter Sagebrush—at which point, I stopped believing anything he said.

There was one problem with the Virgins back in the day a bottle of Cruzan Gold rum cost 82 cents at the Long Bay Woolworths and it seemed to me that if I wasn't drunk, I was wasting money. (Of course, I occasionally attempted to stop being a rummy by the application/inhalation of a well-known West Indian herbal medication—without much success.)

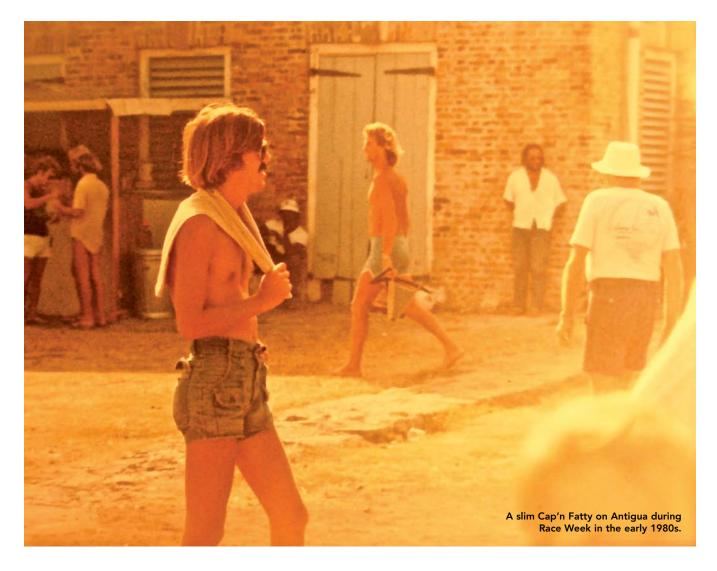

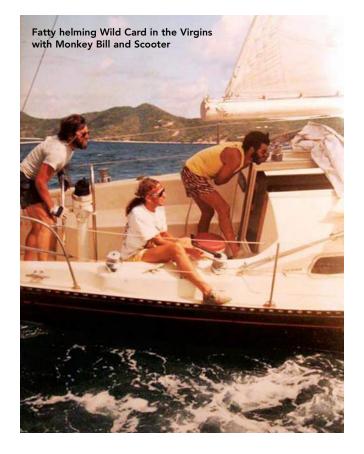

Out in Red Hook was Johnny Harms who had a crowded liars table at his waterfront bar—not that any honest fish head would wander in. We dropped the hook amid the Lagoonies in Brenner Bay Lagoon—and bumped into Timothy Carstar**phen** being drowned (well, almost) by an evil Russian Princess.

Okay, in Timothy's defense, the Russian gal was hot, hot, hot! Oh, dem were de days, me son! Timothy, Parker Hall, Austin Gumbs, Mighty Whitey, Mace, Tim Peck, I, and numerous other reprobates used to terrorize Bottom's Up throughout the '80s. I'm still friends with Timothy's sister **Tere** of schooner Maverick fame—she lives in NZ now.)

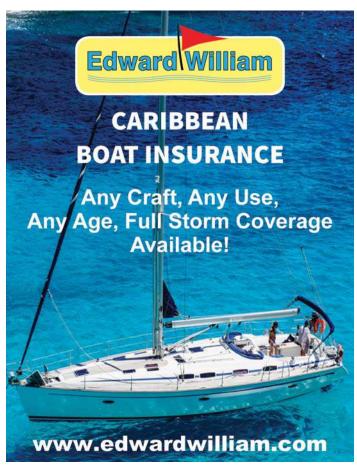

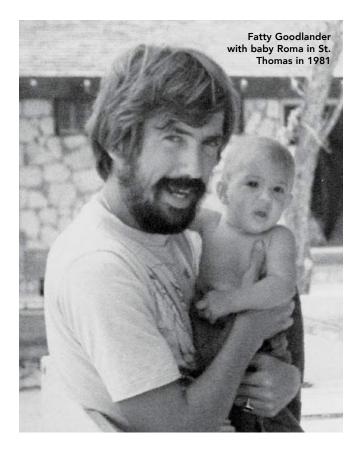

I used to love anchoring in spacious Cruz Bay in the 1970s when artist Les Anderson, architect Glen Spear, Albert Willis, Bob Nose, Forest Fischer, and Professor Gilbert Sprauve might wander by while Russian opera star Ivan Jadan would sing like a caged bird (when Ivan wasn't planting Lignum Vitae trees throughout the island, of course).

Oh, the local yacht racing scene was quite liberal in those days—especially the big-breasted babes racing with plastic surgeon Doctor Tattersall of the Purple Palace with his rainbow-breast-flag and his professional motto of 'Tits by Tat!'

Yes, the Holmberg Brothers were playing in the sand at the STYC. This was long before Taylor Canfield was a gleam in father Bill's eye.

Actor Kelsey Grammer could be seen wandering about—but actress Lisa Canning and porn star Jasmin St. Claire were too young for me to remember. (Ditto, basketballer Tim Duncan.) World champ boxer Julian Jackson, however, was a familiar sight on St. Croix. Of course, Alexander Hamilton was long before my time—I've only seen him on a ten-dollar bill.

I do, however, remember a tennis star and school chum of my daughter's, Hannah Jeter, who ended up on the cover of Sport's Illustrated 2015 swimsuit issue—my, how they grow!

But the most amazing thing about my arrival in the Virgins during the late 1970s was that it was all actually true—utterly true that the Virgins were paradise on earth for wayward sailors.

That bullrider named Fritz Seyfarth in the Bahamas told me to look up Dyke and Inga Wilmerding on Zulu Warrior and that couple amused me for years telling wild tales of the early days of chartering aboard their wooden Alden schooner Mandoo. They turned me on to Pieter and Pat Stoeken—Pat still helms their beloved CYS Independence on daysails to St. John. Both introduced me to **Neil Lewis** of the Nevis-built schooner *Alexander* Hamilton, an ex-disc jockey at the local radio station WSTA. Neil played guitar and had a deep, thrilling voice. He also refused to say whether he did have, or did not have, an affair with author/actress/commie Lillian Hellman. Neil was an old '60s radical—one of his boats had a red star on its mainsail and was named Red Hooker. (Sadly, I gave Neil's eulogy at Latitude 18 awhile back.)

Oh, the early charterers of the VI who berthed an international industry were a fascinating bunch of rummies. Dick and Joni Stout of Dragon, for example, had a cut-off switch on their shower pump next to the captain's place at the galley—where Dick would shout that he'd 'see if he could get the fresh water pump working long enough for you to rinse off' to his guests. 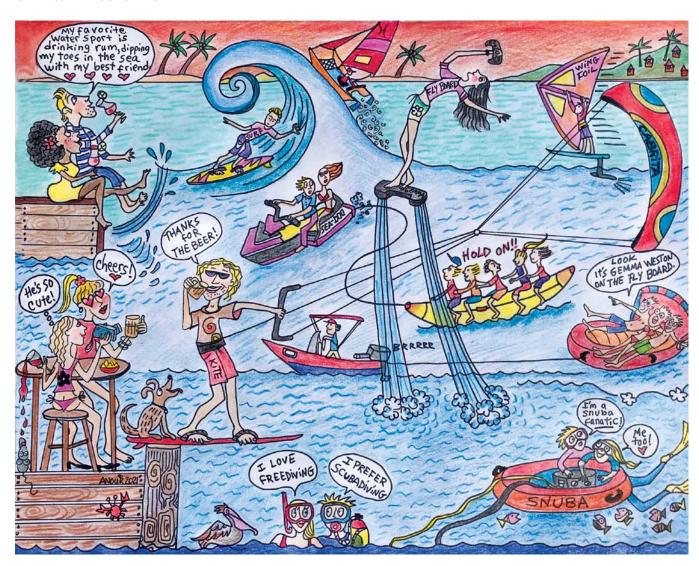

SAILING WITH CHARLIE: JULY WATERSPORTS

he Caribbean is the best location in the world to partake in water sports; the water is warm, gentle breezes waft through the atmosphere, the turquoise star-spangled rippling ... (Jeez, sometimes Charlie waxes poetic). Seriously, take a look at all the watersports options out there. There's snorkeling – now evolved into Snuba: a deep snorkel where you breathe air through a tube from a tank at the surface. 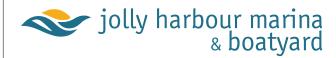
One of the latest thrills is flyboarding (less than 10 years since its invention). A flyboard rider stands on a board connected by a long hose to a watercraft. Water is forced under pressure to a pair of boots worn by the flyboarder, with jet nozzles underneath which provide thrust for the rider to fly up in the air and do tricks like backflips, loops, dives and more. Charlie is dying to try it and has bought brown underwear to go with his first attempt.

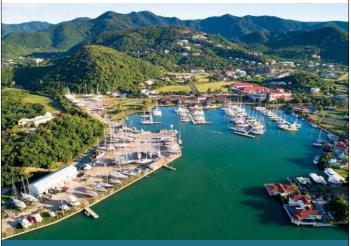
Surfing will always be watersport #1. In the winter months Caribbean islands with exposed north shore beaches will often have super wave breaks for surfing. There are no fancy gadgets here, just a board, you and your skill.

Charter boat guests often want a fun time without serious challenges. Paragliding fits the bill here with fabulous panoramic views, as does donut riding (being dragged behind a fast inflatable in an inflated ring and hanging on for dear life as the driver of the boat tries to tip you out by making fast, tight turns. Screams of delight are proof that fun in the sun is happening.

So, you can see the Caribbean is not just rum and reggae but a whole lot more. Grab the moment and get the adrenaline flowing.

How to make gelcoat shine in the Caribbean?

Answer: Chalk is the Enemy!

Il cans of polish or rubbing compound come with instructions and I would be the last to recommend ignoring those instructions. NOTE: These instructions are often written for more temperate climes compared to our sun drenched and salty conditions in the Caribbean.



A recent effort at improving the gelcoat of my 1989 model sailboat reminded me to first establish the amount of chalking of the gelcoat. This is the easiest thing in the world because you simply need to rub your finger over a part of the gelcoat. If you find, as I did that the top layer consisted of chalk then forget using bottles of anything and start with wet dry sandpaper. If it is as bad as mine was then start with 500 grit and finish with 1000 grit.

We are talking about hand sanding. If you avoid sanding by hand and use a machine the buffing pad will load up with lots of the non-shining mix of chalk and polish and you will have to wash the buffing pad more often than necessary.

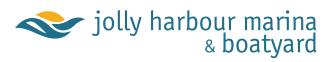
When the chalk test and potential sanding is complete, you can go back to using bottles being either the multi bottle system (rubbing compound and then polish) or a one step restorer and polish.

If you use the bottles with heavy chalking then your result will be a frustrating and dull surface where the bottled products have combined with a great deal of chalk and there is no shine to be had no matter how optimistic the instructions on the bottles were.

Don't be intimidated by the idea that using sandpaper when ultimately you are looking for a shine is counter productiveyou must get rid of the chalk!

ANTIGUANS MAKE THEIR MARK IN THE AMERICA'S CUP

ntigua and Barbuda resident's loyalty was split three ways when it came to cheering at the 36th America's Cup, which sailed in March in New Zealand. That's because three island sons each raced on different teams. Shannon Falcone, with five Cups already under his belt, sailed for the Italian Luna Rossa Prada Pirelli team. Louis Sinclair, who was on the roster for Oracle Team USA in the last Cup, served as a grinder for Cup winner Emirates Team New Zealand. Sinclair's younger brother, Alex, made his America's Cup debut as a grinder for the New York Yacht Club's American Magic. It's incredible to consider that one island nation that measures a little more than half the size of New York City can boast not one, but three sailors in the most recent America's Cup.

A SPORT STARTED IN CHILDHOOD

Falcone was born in England and sailed to Antigua with his family at age 3.

"In my generation in the Caribbean, there wasn't the dinghy program that there is now. As a kid, you got into keelboats, big boats right away. Maybe it was sailing with your parents or your parent's friends. Heineken, Rolex, BVI, the Classics and Sailing Week, we did them all. The Caribbean has always attracted big talent. So, there you are as a kid, sailing with professionals and it was something to really soak up," says Falcone, now age 40.

Falcone also sailed Stars with his father Carlo Falcone, who competed in the same boat at the 1992 Summer Olympics. He left home at age 19, completing ocean deliveries, a circumnavigation, Louis Vuitton Cups and two Volvo Ocean Races along the way. Falcone won the 2010 and 2013 America's Cups as a member of Oracle Team USA.

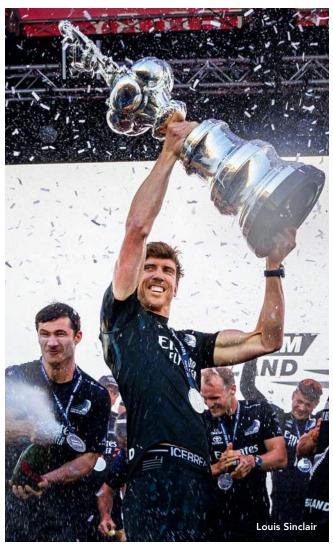
Louis Sinclair, now age 29, started sailing at the Antigua Yacht Club when he was in primary school under coach Karl James. He decided to turn pro as a teenager.

"I feel lucky to have gotten the opportunity to join a sailing boat in English Harbour when I was 17. That set me on the path I am on now 12 years later," says Sinclair.

Born in New Zealand, Sinclair was raised on his mother, Nancy Nicholson's, home island of Antigua. Louis's big boat experience is impressive having raced aboard Leopard 3 and 100ft Super Maxi Comanche in the past. He has Volvo Ocean Race experience and is now a two-time America's Cup veteran.

Younger brother Alex is also New Zealand-born and Antiguan-raised.







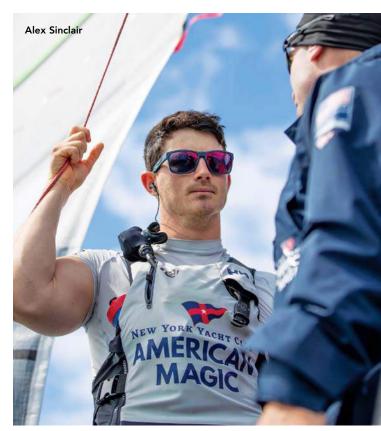
"I feel extremely fortunate to be sailing at a high level of the sport and a lot of that is thanks to growing up in Antigua. As a kid, you spend a lot of time in and on the water which gives you such a great foundation for any water sport really. I started sailing with Karl James as an after-school activity and things took off from there. That and the combination of having many high-performance race boats based in Antigua for their Caribbean season gave me a great pathway into the sport as long as I was willing to work hard enough."

Sinclair left the island after high school, obtained his Yachtmaster certificate in Europe and embarked on a professional sailing career culminating in making the American Magic America's Cup Team.

Looking ahead, all three men have impressive sailing plans. Falcone is team captain for Antigua & Barbuda in the new Star Sailor League, and the Sinclair brothers are both on the SailGP tour, Louis with New Zealand and Alex with the U.S.

ADVICE FOR YOUNG CARIBBEAN SAILORS

What advice does each of them have for young Caribbean sailors who aspire to sail professionally in the upper echelons of the sport?











"Today, being a good sailor is not enough. You must be good at everything, being a team player, open-minded, sharing ideas, understanding other points of view and communicating well in a big team. Secondary skill sets are important too. That could be being good at hardware, or rigging, electronics or hydraulics. Look to apprentice in these systems," says Falcone, who in 2013 brought the Cup to the National Sailing Academy in Antigua to show and inspire the next generation.

Louis Sinclair recommends, "Get a full-time sailing/racing boat and work your way up from there. Starting on dinghies is good when you're young, but to make a career of it, it helps to learn the big."

Finally, physical fitness is especially important so the earlier you can start training the better, says Alex. "Work hard and stay focused, opportunities will present themselves. And take advantage of living on a Caribbean island, get out on the water."

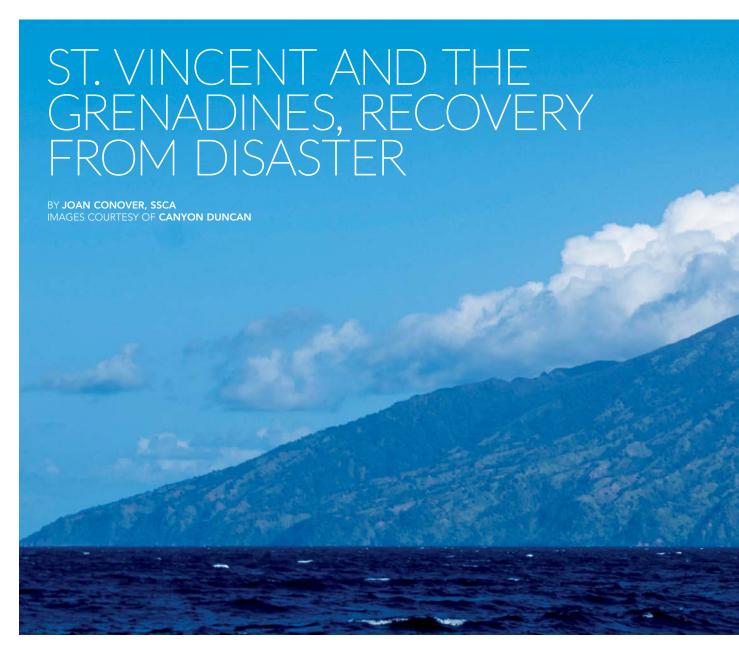

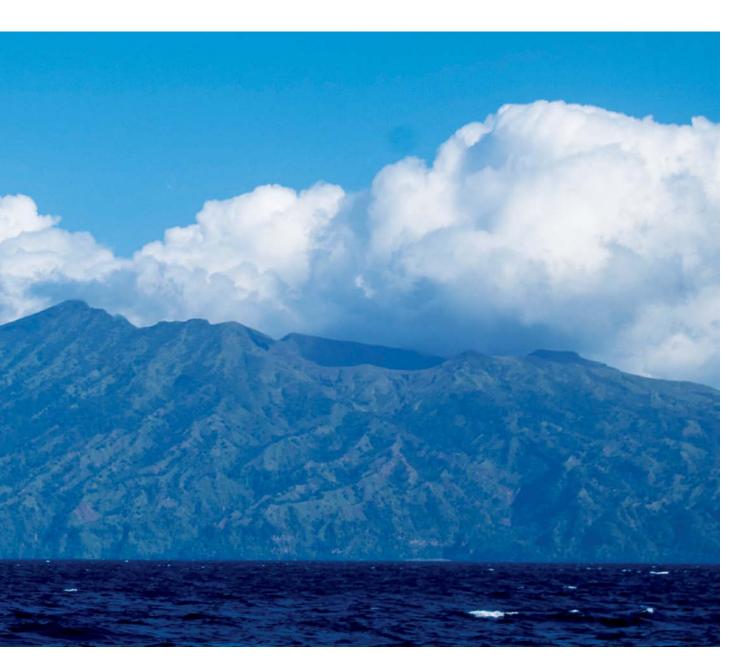




fter months of unrest, on April 9, 2021, St Vincent's **La Soufrière** volcano exploded violently, covering St. Vincent, the Grenadines, and Barbados with ash fallout. Now after close to two months, the volcano eruption phase has been classified as "orange", down from "red" eruptive levels; this could change at any time. The volcano, while not dormant, has entered a quieter phase. This event is being continuously monitored by the University of the West Indies, St. Augustine, Trinidad and Tobago, Seismic Research Centre (UWI-SRC). The center is the official source of information for earthquakes and volcanoes in the English-speaking Eastern Caribbean. A 3-person team composed of senior scientists and technicians from The UWI-SRC and the Montserrat Volcano Observatory (MVO) is

currently on island. This team, based at the Belmont Observatory, works closely with local authorities to monitor the volcano. Scientists are observing for possible changes, however, the St. Vincent situation seems stable per reports from http://uwiseismic.com

Life in St Vincent and the Grenadines is going back to post COVID normal, stores, restaurants and cafes are open, wifi works, and boats are on anchor harbor in Bequia and southern anchorages of St. Vincent. The Tobago Cays and the rest of Grenadines, due to the COVID situation, are experiencing low occupancy. In the Grenadines, where it was hard to anchor in the past, few boats swing at anchor; it's back to the 1950s-60s flavor for the now quiet anchorages.

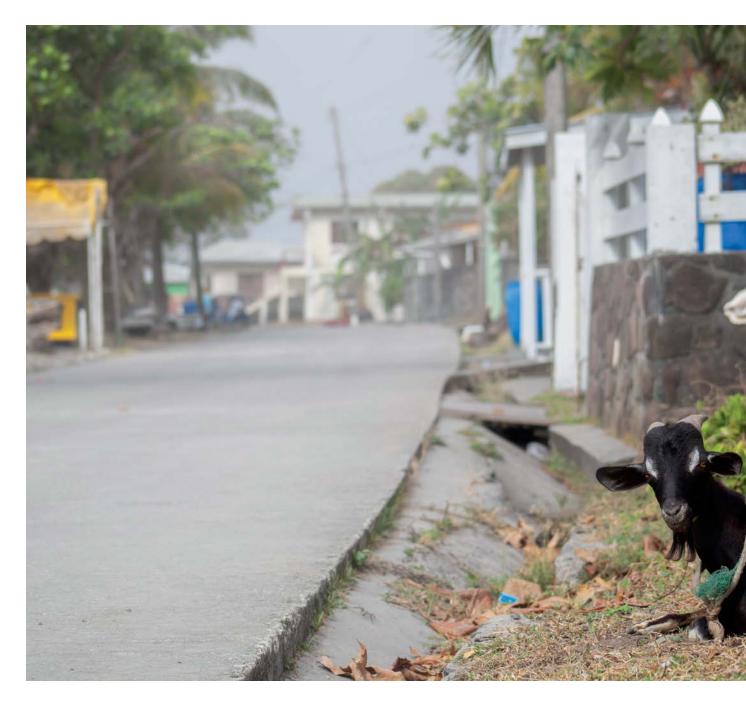


Life in St Vincent and the Grenadines is going back to post COVID normal, stores, restaurants and cafes are open, wifi works, and boats are on anchor harbor in Bequia and southern anchorages of St. Vincent.

Regarding country entry, the only place vessels can clear into St. Vincent and the Grenadines is Young Island/Blue Lagoon. Boats arriving from other foreign ports must go to St. Vincent first. However, as of May 20, 2021, there are no issues there,

cruisers are reporting enjoying other St Vincent anchorages such as Cumberland. Boats are told to avoid the northern part of the island, whether for stopping or even sailing close to shore. Airports are open for support services, and airlines such as Virgin are planning to restart commercial services. Ferries, while still utilized for supporting resupply, are back in post-COVID operations. Recovery is in progress.

In the first post eruption period, vessels in St Vincent, and Bequia faced ash fall, centimeters and in some locations, inches deep. Most boats evacuated south, leaving the island for the Grenadines and then further south to Carriacou and Grenada. No one knew what might happen, a massive evacuation of people from the red zone around the volcano occurred; boats



rapidly left, heading south in ash fall. One boat crew Captain David and First Mate Nikki Bettis, on SV BooRei, not only were sitting in a cafe in St. Vincent when the first eruption happened, they experienced the ash effects as they sailed south at hull speed towards the Grenadines. The ash coated SV BooRei's 42 ft topsides, evenly spread several cm over dodger windows, with gray/white ash finding every nook and cranny inside. David Bettis covered the engine air intake vents, they both wore masks and goggles. They reported frequently on status during passage, a rather concerning exodus. Boorei finally dropped the hook in a friendly Grenadine harbor, sitting and waiting

out the next days. It took Nikki ten days to get the ash dust cleaned up. They communicated with photos to Facebook and comments over the long weeks of waiting out the eruption. Per fleet maps, most boats were gathered in the southern part of the Grenadines, few headed west.

Warning was given to wear masks and goggles, not breathe in ash, not run reverse osmosis systems if ash in the intake water, and rinse, not brush off, to clean off ash deposits. The ash is bad for air intakes, boats put covers over intake ports, and cleaned filters frequently. As mentioned above, boats from







St Vincent and Bequia areas headed to Tobago Cays or at least the more southern areas of the Grenadines. Per Nikki, of Boorei, it really did not make much difference as to ash where they finally anchored; ash fall was all the way to Grenada, who got a light dusting. Barbados faced heavy ash fall, it was as dark as night midday when winds from the west and south west moved ash clouds over the island. St. Lucia, not only had a view of the eruption from the Pitons, but also a slight dusting during the first eruptions. Now that all has resolved, only ash on lands around the volcano and swept down slopes in lahars is a problem. The most recent images of the volcano

show denuded slopes, a gray dusty ash covered rocky mountain, a lahar generator in seasonal rains.

While at first there was tremendous concern regarding the pandemic, due to the low vaccination numbers of only 14K out of approximately 110K citizens. Shelters started major COVID testing and immunization efforts. Several commercial cruise ships stood by to expatriate citizens to St. Martin, but finally left with just US and UK citizens. St Vincent's population wanted to stay with their homes and families. Then as time passed, the feared full blown epidemic in the shelter environ-



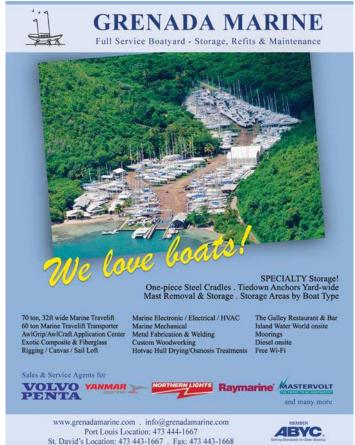

ment did not happen. Numbers peaked, but the most recent count was two new cases. The island has, as of recent count, a low percentage of cases.

Currently, for passage around St Vincent, boats should be aware to give leeway around the northern red zone. Approximately the northern 1/3 of the main island is under Orange alert due to possible ash venting; but the main concern is due to lahars. Lahars, mudflows with large rocks, trees and debris, can move at miles per hour, and scour out river beds, buildings, towns, land and roadways. These lahars, have reached all northern coastlines such as Sandy Bay on the east, on the west and on the north sides of the 'red zone." See information, guidance and the photo gallery at http://nemo.gov.vc/nemo. Most recent flows are caused by rain washing down loose debris and ash from the volcano slopes. The concern of the danger is clearly indicated by the warnings in the weather reports provided daily by St Vincent's National Emergency Management Organization (NEMO). Additionally, vessels should plan to keep a watch for debris in the waters around the island. Trees or lumber or other floating objects and passaging vessels do not mix well.

Bequia is experiencing a resurgence in visiting boaters, clearly found in both the filling anchorage but also in the open restaurants and cafes. It's business as usual for Beguia and some southern harbors of St. Vincent. A good site to check for current openings, menus and events is the free and local online www.begos.com; this website also lists COVID information, provides links to government sites for customs and more. Also donation and supply needs are listed; various foreign countries are continuing to send donations; the needs are ongoing even when the media outlets find other topics of interest. The most important information to know is not only the status of the volcano and COVID, but donation

sites. Several non-profits, such as Rise Up Bequia, and Action Bequia are listed at BEGOS, as well as government donation agencies, all of which go to help the impacted people of St. Vincent. Evidently there have been bogus money schemes, stealing much needed rebuilding funds.

With the downgrading to "orange," life in the southern area of St. Vincent has returned to as normal as an island can with approximately 20,000 evacuated people living in shelters and or private homes in the southern areas of the island. Life has a new normal for these people, nights in shelters and days going back 'home' if they can to clean up, rebuild and take care of their property. Agriculture has certainly been affected, the weight of ash covering plants has broken branches. The heat of the ash, the larger gravel ash deposits, from both heat and weight impacts both ground crops and fruits/bananas. It will take years for production to recover in some areas. However, ash is fertile, and once worked into the land, as in the 1902 and 1979 events, plant life grows back at tropical speeds.

The COVID situation, with the St. Vincent government willing

to vaccinate visiting cruisers, did not seem to be an issue for those boats passaging south away from the impacted areas. The crew of Boorei were vaccinated at Union Island with the COVID vaccine used in St. Vincent, Oxford/Astrazeneca.

They were vaccinated prior to the eruption, as cruisers took part in the program. This helped passaging, as with COVID vaccination, Grenada has loosened requirements for yachts/crews. Entry regulations are easier. For example, vessels sign

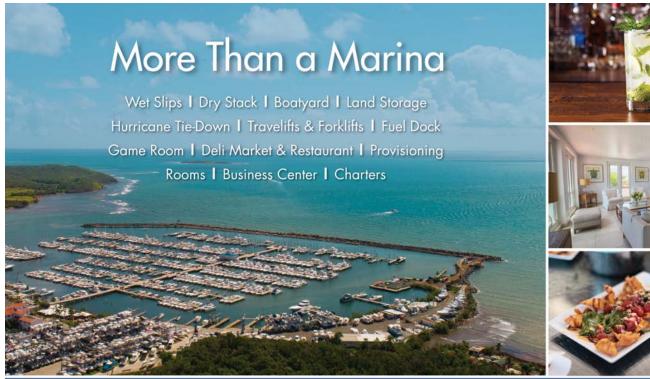

in via Sailclear, then make mooring arrangements with Dockwa. Currently, Dockwa is providing a mooring area, partnering with Grenada to provide an official quarantine area for boat entry. Other areas/countries have deployed various strategies in a similar fashion.

St Vincent is developing a rebuilding plan for the island's infrastructure and evacuees. Sadly, as in Sandy Bay, some or many may not be able to return to their old homes, lahar damage in some areas has redesigned the entire landscape. The infrastructure of the northern 1/3 of the main island, roads and water systems have been severely damaged. However the electric grid was rapidly restored, but not so much to the homes who collapsed or were damaged by ash fall, earthquake and flooding/lahars.

During COVID, and now during the post eruption phase, Seven Seas Cruising Association recommends to check local country requirements and also review the latest information on www.noonsite.com; this site is updated by a volunteer group feeding information worldwide. Seven Seas Cruising Association(SSCA) and Ocean Cruising Club(OCC) organiza-

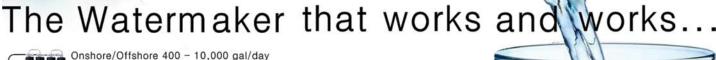


tions are all collaborating in this "years long" effort to keep cruisers informed via Noonsite as the major information hub.

It will take time and a definite plan to rebuild infrastructure, homes, livelihoods such as St Vincent tourism. St Vincent is resilient, will experience "tropical speed" recovery of the environment, and is opening up for tourism again.















ackaging a rum in a box creates an air of fascination and entices us to want to know more. The tall brown cylinder of Ron Añejo Calazan Reserve Aged 10 Years immediately drew us in wanting to explore.

Calazan rum is produced by Alcoholes y Añejos Monagas CA, in the eastern part of Venezuela. The name Calazan pays tribute to Rodolfo Esteban Gil, better known as Calazan, who was a pioneer in the distillation of rum. As a teenager, Rodolfo arrived on the shores of Carupano, Venezuela with some shoes, a copper alembic (a simple distillation apparatus used for distilling alcohol), and his passion. Around 1930, he and his wife bought some land that would become the first sugarcane plantation in Venezuela. With spring water and stills, he and his nine children distilled 80 proof alcohol in non-continuous stills. Soon Calazan learned and perfected the art of aging rum in barrels creating a unique quality not seen before in the country.

Today, Alcoholes y Añejos Monagas CA creates Calazan rums

with this same passion. The company sources molasses alcohol from four distilleries located in different states of Venezuela. After distillation, the rums are aged in American White Oak barrels from Kentucky. Ron Añejo Calazan Reserve is a blend of rums aged for more than 10 years. All Calazan rums have the Designation of Origin (DOC) seal given to only 13 Venezuelan rum brands that meet all the standards and requirements in Venezuela.

HE SAID

The nose is bold with a fragrant bouquet featuring creamy oak notes with molasses, hints of orange essence, and toasted coconut. The nose reminds me of Santa Teresa 1796, another Venezuelan rum, that had these same, rich notes on the nose but initially burned on the palate. Not this rum. The liquid is light on the tip of the tongue then opens up as it engulfs the palate. The toasted coconut takes the point with the orange and molasses subtly sitting in the background. The finish is all about the oak which, to my disappointment, dissipates rather guickly.

SHE SAID

The golden amber color lightly coats the glass with long, slow legs. For me, the nose is sweet with caramel and coffee mixed with French vanilla cream. The creaminess of the nose does not carry to the palate. I lose the caramel and French vanilla but still get the strong coffee note with some red plums. I agree with Clint that the front end of the palate lacks character; however I disagree with him that the finish dissipates quickly. I find the rum warms, but lacks any notes to hold my attention.

OVERALL

We significantly differ on this rum. Clint enjoys how oak forward Ron Añejo Calazan Reserva Aged 10 Years is while Terry just couldn't find any notes to bring her back for more. At \$29/ bottle, we feel Calazan could offer more depth and character.

CARIBBEAN COOKING BY CAP'N JAN ROBINSON

n America and in the summer, Americans love to drink iced drinks, ice cream, and other cold foods along with lots of air conditioning. Yes, it does feel good, but..... there is another way to cool off. Did you know that drinking hot drinks and eating hot foods is actually proven to cool you down! Some of the hottest climates in the world like southeast Asia, India, and the Caribbean are great examples and proof. These cultures eat hot foods and drink hot beverages daily.

When you eat something hot your body's receptors take note. Your brain tells your body it needs to cool down and your internal temperature regulators kick in. You may sweat a bit, but your circulation will improve and that is a good thing!

GINGER AND TURMERIC TEA

Prep time: 5 minutes. Cooking time: 20 minutes. Serves: 2 2-1/2 cups filtered water 1-inch of fresh *turmeric, sliced thinly 2-inches of fresh ginger, sliced thinly ½ tsp. freshly ground black pepper 1 tsp. honey (optional)

Place water, turmeric, ginger, and pepper in a small saucepan. Bring to a boil, then turn to low and simmer for about 20 minutes. Strain tea into cups and add honey if needed.

NOTE: This recipe is a wonderful anti-inflammatory tea. Turmeric is used for many medicinal purposes in India and refreshing on a hot day. * Remember turmeric stains.

CHICKPEA TACOS WITH AVOCADO AND RED CABBAGE

Prep time: 10 minutes. Cooking time: 10 minutes. Serves: 2-4

1 Tbsp. olive oil

1 (15 oz.) can chickpeas (aka garbanzo beans)

1 tsp. ground cumin 1 tsp. chili powder

1/2 tsp. smoked paprika

½ tsp. sea salt 1/4 tsp. cayenne pepper Freshly ground black pepper, to taste

2 cups shredded red cabbage

1 avocado

1 Tbsp. EVOO

1 Tbsp. fresh squeezed lime or lemon juice

4 Tortillas

GARNISH: extra lime wedges or cherry tomatoes

Drain and rinse chickpeas. Warm olive oil in a skillet over mediumhigh heat. Add chickpeas and sprinkle with cumin, chili powder, paprika, salt, cayenne, and black pepper. Stir to coat, then let them crisp up for about 2 minutes, giving them the occasional stir. Turn



to medium and let cook about another 8 minutes. Peel, deseed, and slice up the avocado (squeeze lime or lemon juice over to prevent browning) The chickpeas should be nice and crispy. Toss together the cabbage and avocado with oil and lime or lemon juice.

TO SERVE: Charred or warmed tortillas, shredded cabbage, sliced avocado, and wedged limes

EASY HOT AND SOUR SOUP

Prep time: 15 minutes. Cooking time: 15 minutes. Makes: 10 cups

2 Tbsp. canola oil

4 cloves garlic, minced

1 Tbsp. freshly grated ginger

3 (3.5 oz) packages fresh shitake mushrooms. stemmed and sliced

7 cups vegetable stock or chicken stock

1 (9 oz) can sliced bamboo shoots, drained and cut into slivers

½ cup reduced sodium soy sauce

1/3 cup seasoned rice vinegar

2 tsp. fish sauce

1-1/2 tsp. chili garlic sauce

½ tsp. freshly ground black pepper

1 (8 oz.) package firm tofu, drained and cubed

3 Tbsp. cornstarch

1/4 cup water

1 large egg, lightly beaten

1 green onion thinly sliced

1 tsp. sesame oil

Heat canola oil in a large stockpot or Dutch oven over medium heat. Stir in garlic and ginger. Cook until fragrant, about 1 minute. Stir in mushrooms until wilted, about 3 minutes. Stir in vegetable stock, bamboo shoots, soy sauce, rice vinegar, fish sauce, chili garlic sauce, and pepper. Bring to a boil; reduce heat and simmer until flavors have blended, about 10 minutes. Stir in tofu. In a small bowl, whisk together cornstarch and 1/4 cup water; stir in cornstarch mixture, stirring frequently, until slightly thickened, about 3 minutes. Gradually add egg in a slow steady stream, stirring with a fork. Cook until the eggs are set, stirring frequently to create ribbons, about 2 minutes. Remove from heat; stir in green onion and 0 sesame oil. Serve immediately.

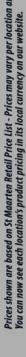
