





BRISA NAMES FIRST FEMALE COMMODORE

History is made! In June, the Board of Directors of BRISA, Inc., a non-profit organization of sailors with fleets in the east, south, and west of Puerto Rico, voted unanimously for Enid Marie Reyes to represent the organization's eastern fleet as the first female commodore. Reyes, a native of the island, spent the last decade living in Texas. There, she not only learned to sail but raced in major regattas such as the Fort Lauderdale to Key West Race and the Lakewood Yacht Club's Harvest Moon Regatta, both on a Hobie 33. In 2016, Reyes was a member of the team winning the coveted trophy at the George Griffith Regatta, held at the Rush Creek Yacht Club. She moved back to Puerto Rico in 2018.

"Building and re-building our fleets and getting more people into sailing. Creating new platforms such as family-friendly events and opening the door for more women to sail as skippers and crew. These are some of my goals. My biggest goal is to have a major regatta in two years. One that offers excellence, is well done, and brings back the glory days of sailing in Puerto Rico," says Reyes.

In addition to her passion for sailing, Reyes brings to BRISA her valuable experience as a leader and educator.

She currently serves as the Executive Director of the Puerto Rico Education Foundation, a non-profit organization dedicated to providing resources for the strengthening, strategic innovation, and transformation of education on the island.

"BRISA is celebrating 15 years since its founding, and now we also celebrate a new chapter in Puerto Rican nautical history with the appointment of the first female commodore. SALTY DAWGS TEAM WITH NARC TO ADD **NEWPORT, RI START TO FALL CARIBBEAN RALLY**

Networking and new opportunities are on the horizon for two popular USA to Caribbean fall cruising rallies. First, the Salty Dawg Sailing Association (SDSA) will add a Newport, RI, start to its SDSA Caribbean Rally, in addition to its traditional start in Hampton, VA.

"There are a couple of reasons why we wanted to add the Newport start," explains Bob Osborn, SDSA president. "For one, we had 82 boats last year, and a third of our fleet are catamarans, and there is only so much room in Hampton. We're expecting some 100 boats this year. Also, for anyone coming from New England, having to go down to Hampson for the start adds an-





other week. Leaving Newport is different from Hampton. The Gulf Stream is further out, and it's late season. So, there are more challenges, and more experience, and larger boats are best."

The SDSA Newport start teams with the North American Rally to the Caribbean (NARC), founded by Hank Schmitt, CEO of Offshore Passage Opportunities (OPO), who for the past twenty-plus years has delivered Swans to the Caribbean. The two rallies, which will remain separate entities this year organizationally, will share docking, facilities, meeting, and party spaces in Newport. Both will cast off around November 1, depending on weather. The SDSA will offer the option of a Bermuda stop for those coming from Newport and Hampton, and a stop in Bermuda, where there is usually shoreside entertainment and activities, is a staple for the NARC. From there, the Dawgs will sail to Antiqua and NARC ralliers to St Maarten, as in past years. This team-up marks the beginnings of a bigger change for 2023.

"The SDSA wanted to offer a Newport start so our goal this year is to introduce them to all my contacts in Newport and Bermuda and St Maarten so they can organize the rally next year from Newport," explains Schmitt, who plans to devote more time to his crew networking business, OPO. "I plan to then join their rally with my small Swan fleet and continue to end in St. Maarten. I am calling it the NARC/SDSA Rally this year and I think they will call it the SDSA/NARC Rally from Newport. Next year, we will drop the NARC name. If all goes well, it will only be the SDSA Caribbean Rally next year." www.sailopo.com/ NARC_2022.aspx, www.saltydawgsailing.org/caribbean-rally

BRANSON OFFERS ENTREPRENEURIAL TIPS WHILE CRUISING THE BAHAMAS

Billionaire Sir Richard Branson spent his birthday in boot camp in the Bahamas. Goodbye to The Wharf, hello to the Ocean View Marina by the end of 2023. Suntex Marina Investors, LLC, purchased the property, located in Marathon, in the Florida Keys, earlier this year. The Dallas, TXheadquartered company plans to make a significant investment as well as the name change. Currently, the property features the newest dry storage facility in the Keys, which was developed in 2021. After construction by Suntex is complete, Ocean View will be a full-service marina, offering an easy-to-access fuel dock, boat rentals, a ship's store, and 165 racks with dry storage for up to 40-foot boats in two dry storage barns that are each covered on three sides.

"Ocean View Marina is conveniently located in the heart of Marathon, within walking distance to Publix for provisioning and Home Depot to grab any last-minute tools before a crossing is made. Ocean View will offer 24-hour Rec 90 fuel for fueling," says Hunter Spitler, regional manager, Suntex Marinas.

Marathon is one hour north of Key West and two hours south of Miami, making it an ideal destination for cruising clubs and yacht rendezvous. Located near the famous Seven Mile Bridge, it provides access to



the Atlantic Ocean and Gulf of Mexico for fishing, diving, and pleasure boating. Ocean View Marina is also near attractions and amenities such as dolphin experiences, museums, private beaches, diving excursions, and great restaurants.

This acquisition plants Suntex's footprint even more firmly in the Florida Keys. In the last year, the company has purchased Faro Blanco in Marathon, Caloosa Cove in Islamorada, and Garrison Bight in Key West. suntex.com

NEW ATLANTIC POSSE YACHT RALLY TO LAUNCH THIS FALL FROM SPAIN

Now there's a new way to cruise in company from Europe to the Caribbean and back. The Atlantic Posse, modeled after the highly successful Panama Posse, where over 100 vessels cruise between Southern California and Annapolis via the Panama Canal and explore the Central American, Pacific, and Western Caribbean waters in a 'sail at your own schedule' pace, will begin in Cartagena, Spain.

"We anticipate 50 to 75 yachts to leave Cartagena with an additional kickoff in Lisbon, Portugal, says Captain Dietmar Petutschnig, who with Skipper Jacques Felt, are organizers as part of their yachting travel experience company, Ocean Posse LLC. "Yachts will go at their own pace sailing safely while having fun. There is no set start or end date. That said, the first yachts will arrive in the Caribbean in January. This will depend on weather and how much time our participants explore Morocco, Madeira, the Canary Islands, and Cape Verde before making landfall in Martinique."

After that, it's on to Dominica, Guadeloupe, Montserrat, Saint Kitts and Nevis, Saba, the U.S. Virgin Islands, Puerto Rico, and the Dominican Republic. Based on survey data from the Panama Posse, each vessel spends an average of US \$4,500 in country, according to Petutschnig. Therefore, with 75 vessels and a 9-month time frame, the total economic activity will be roughly US \$3 million. That figure could be more if rally participants decide to lay up their vessels on the hard during hurricane season versus sailing out of the hurricane zone.

The Atlantic Posse's eastward route takes advantage of the Gulf Stream and high-pressure systems for yachts to travel from the Caribbean via Bermuda to the Azores and back to Lisbon.

Joining the Atlantic Posse brings multiple benefits to participants, says Petutschnig. This includes a reduced registration fee, collective bargaining, free fleet, and vessel tracking, 24/7 chat communications, weekly weather, and logistics group calls, OPEN CPN Satellite Charts, West Marine Pro discounts of up to 25%, a Predict Wind Pro discount of 20%, and significant discounts from participating marinas. atlanticposse.com

The Scrub Island Resort, Spa & Marina, in the British Virgin Islands, makes the most of this 'tight lines' time by hosting its invitational fishing series. In past years, the series has attracted an impressive line-up of boats. It's made up of two separate three-day tournaments, with all teams competing for prize money and the covered series title. This is invitation-


61st Annual International Marlin Tournament.

Hosted by the Montego Bay Yacht Club in Jamaica, nearly 20 boats are expected to fish for blue marlin as well as wahoo, tuna, and mahi-mahi (dorado). "The fishing is what makes this

event so much fun, although we also have a fabulous fishing shirt this year," says Denise Taylor, one of the organizers. Peak blue marlin season spans from August to October off Montego Bay, making this tournament perfect timing. What's more, fishing is right offshore. The Cayman Trench is located about a half-mile north of the island, where the baitfishfilled drop-off is some 2000-foot deep. In 2019, the 17-boat fleet released 19 blue marlin. The event week kicks off with its native Canoe Tournament fishing on the 12th, followed by its Powerboat Tournament from the 14th to the 16th, and ends on the 17th with a Children's tournament. In addition to cash, prizes, and bragging rights, the Top Boat winner of the Powerboat Tournament qualifies to compete in the Offshore World Championship held in Costa Rica each April. The Club is located on the Freeport Peninsula, with berthing, consisting of a finger pier with a T-head, in the protected Montego Bay Harbour. www.mobayyachtclub.com/fishing

SEPTEMBER 24: Francis Nunes Jr. Memorial Tournament & Seafood Festival.

New for 2022 is a venue change to the Falmouth Harbour Marina. Twenty to 25 boats from Antigua and neighboring Guadeloupe are expected to compete to see who can catch the most and largest wahoo, tuna, mahi mahi, and kingfish. Back at the docks, and before the prizegiving, there's the Grace Foods Cooking Contest. Eight teams of four will have 30-minutes to prepare, cook and present a fresh fish dish to a panel of judges. The fun twist is that the fish must be made using local coal in a locally made coal pot without using any lighting fluids. "Being a one-day tournament, the pressure is not as great as our larger tournament in June," says tournament director Robert Hall, of the Antigua & Barbuda Sport Fishing Club hosted event. "The Grace Foods Cooking Contest has added to the overall experience of the seafood theme, and the teams are encouraged by the large crowd of onlookers who are not shy to provide tips on how to get their coal pots lit quickly." www.antiguabarbudasportsfishing.com

S THE BOAT MY VICTIM-

CRUISING

BY CAP'N FATTY GOODLANDER



m a positive thinker and an upbeat kinda sailor who love boats and has made his living singing their praises... but, of course, this is really just a matter of demented perspective. The case could just as easily be made that these boats have ruined my life, made me unemployable, driven me to drink, and kept me penniless.

Take the Alden schooner *Elizabeth*, for example. She practically bankrupted her wealthy owner Lyn Williams of Chicago—then burned and sank. My father, who had a fast growing, highly profitable sign business at the time, purchased her salvage rights (underwater, as-is & where-is) for \$100. Within the year, his business was nearly bankrupt because every penny that it earned went into the 'blackhole' of his new 'super cheap' vessel.

All boats are expensive—but aging wooden vessels in particular make cocaine seem cheap. While you're replacing the horn timber, the stem is rotting. Think you're winning while replacing both garboard planks? Silly you—the frame ends got punky while you were doing so!

Much of my youth was spent playing in the shade of Elizabeth's hull in the shipyard. Her builders said she was 'state of the art' because they'd eliminated butt-blocks and, thus, the free-flow of air between her ceiling and her planking would almost eliminate rot! Plus, as a bonus, the boat was even lighter with no butt-blocks and their lack meant less maintenance, since they didn't rot! How cool is that?

Alas, not very cool at all.

Instead of ending planks on butt-blocks (which could be easily replaced), they ended her carvel planks on her frames. This not only rotted the frames but allowed that evil rot to travel further and spread guicker than ever before—and the frames were almost impossible to replace compared to the butt-blocks.

What was touted as a huge advance was really a cheapening of the product that greatly reduced its life expectancy.

It was a lose-lose-lose that was touted as a win-win-win.














Darn it!

Of course, as a youngster I was all in. Everything about boats and our lifestyle was super-cool at six years of age. For example, if we needed cash money we just unbolted a bronze porthole and lugged it to a scrapyard/pawnshop. Instant cash! As I grew older and smarter I eventually realized that we were scraping far more bronze than we were redeeming—and only getting pennies on the dollar. And how the hell were we going to anchor in Tahiti when we'd just sold our hundred-dollar foredeck cleats for 85 cents?

Yes, I was a happy junior sailor until reality reared its ugly head. Now, you may have heard, dear reader, that many of these huge Alden schooners (like, for example, *Mandoo* and *Caribe*) disappeared into the drug trade, but I have a different theory. Who else but a drug smuggler making millions of dollars a week could afford to buy and maintain such a vessel?

Here's the truth: You don't own a boat, the boat owns you. And not just your money, it's your time, your pride, your everything. If you neglect her, she hits back by, say, sinking, burning, breaking loose...or all three. Here's the truth of it—there's nothing more dangerous than a vessel scorned.

What's that ole parental advice that used to circulate around shipyards back in the day? Buy your son a traditional wooden vessel when he turns 18—and he won't have time to engage in pre-marital sex or to get into legal trouble...nor have enough money to buy drugs either.

Of course, buying sunken boats and/or abandoned vessels probably isn't a good idea, but we Goodlanders do it all the time. Our

vessels are like yo-yos—they're up, they're down, they're up...!

Now, you'd think that watching my father be ruined by his vessel would have taught me something—not so.

I'm a sailor. We sailors don't learn—we just sail away from our problems. That's our sole M.O.

At 15 years of age, I purchased salvage rights to the abandoned 1932 Atkin's double-ender *Corina*. Obviously, I had to drop out of school to rebuild her—and, nach, I had no time for an honest job. How did I support myself and buy parts for my new vessel? By fast-talking slow-thinking girls with jobs (one of whom I just celebrated our 52nd anniversary with) while living aboard, of course, a broken-down vessel with a disassembled engine.

Seriously, it is hard to talk a young lady into the cruising life. I asked my future wife Carolyn a series of questions: One: Would she support me while I worked on my boat? Two: Could she, if she had a second to spare, also work on the boat? Three: Would she be okay with having no jewelry and wearing rags so that the boat could have sails and fancy do-dads? Four: Was she willing to embrace a life of poverty, deprivation, and misery? Five: Did she have anything against puking? Six: Was she cool with being aboard offshore for months at a time? Seven: Would she mind each and every woman who lived ashore looking down on her? Eight: Could she handle being the second-most important female in my life? And lastly, nine: Would she mind having only a sliver of my attention?

No, it isn't easy finding a gal who will happily sign up for all of the above!

The Corina didn't have a rig nor engine when I purchased her. And the boat was so rotten that the only thing keeping her together were the roaches holding hands.

She'd been used as a gang hang-out and they'd not only repeatedly spray-painted the word FOCK inside, but also pooped in the bilge and lit campfires in the forepeak to keep warm during the winter.

Nicel

There wasn't enough money in the world to rebuild that boat properly—and as a gigolo, I could only service so many clients per day, right?

My plan was, needless to say, to sell Corina at a vast profit. And I was delighted to sell her four years later—for exactly half of what I'd spent on her rebuild (not including my time, of course).

Yeah, I am a remarkable entrepreneur. My friends remark (and smile) about my business acumen all the time.

Disgusted with wooden vessels, I next built a ferro-cement ketch by flinching chicken wire from unguarded chicken coops and scooping up cement-dripping from the chutes of unsuspecting cement trucks at construction sites.

Carlotta sailed like a half-tide rock—and weighed about the same, too.

Every time we'd be walking down a sidewalk with friends, my wife would emit a strangled cackle and sing out gayly, "A cement sidewalk, honey—you could build another boat!"

Carlotta took me seven solid years to construct from scratch.

I eventually sold her for one-sixtieth of the money I had into her—a new Goodlander low! (No, I don't include my labor because, if there is one thing my life as a pseudo shipwright has taught me is that my time is utterly worthless.)

My next vessel was a Hurricane Hugo victim that had sunk along the north coast of St. John.

When I told my wife I'd paid \$3,000 for Wild Card as-is, whereis, she initially said, "You got ripped off!" Of course, she later changed her opinion to: "You got royally ripped off, Fatty. What the hell were you thinking?"

Are there any advantages to repeatedly buying boats underwater? Well, yes. Water magnifies. My wife wanted a bigger vessel than the 36-foot Carlotta and Wild Card looked HUGE on the bottom of Mary's Creek. (Of course, I suspected that a Hughes 38 wasn't too much bigger, but why rain on my wife's myopic parade?)

This was my first fiberglass vessel in 1989—and I must say, working with glass is miserable. I itch just writing the word fiberglass! Plus, it ain't just the itching—you have to bathe in various toxic chemicals for months to rebuild a vessel!

And I was so penniless in those days that the only high I could afford was the polyester fumes. Damn!

The finished product was...well, not perfect. I was so ashamed of my craftsmanship and marine wood butchery that I left the VI. Ditto, the Panama Canal, Tahiti, New Zealand—that's right, I circumnavigated twice in that misshaped, frozen-snot-smeared vessel—not because I wanted to see the next port, but because I grew tired of sailors looking at my vessel, shaking their head sadly, and asking in horror, "Who did that to your boat?"





Why Are Horizontal Windlasses **Better Than Vertical?**

he windlasses that survive the longest in the Caribbean are the horizontal models. They work well as long as the cabling to them remains able to carry the heavy loads over the distance from the oftenremote batteries.


Why is it that the horizontals are so resilient is a much-asked question especially by persons who appreciate elegance on yachts and who therefore do not want the relative clutter of a horizontal winch which sticks out over the deck in a quite industrial manner?

The simple cause of the failure of vertical winches is a result of their motor being contained in a very humid and unventilated anchor locker where high speed corrosion is inevitable. If the motor part of the winch is located in a dry area with very little moisture, I would expect that the tables would be turned in respect of resiliency and ability to last long. Unfortunately, there is seldom an opportunity for such a dry cavity and so the goal is to get it through the warranty period of a new yacht and for the tropical water cruiser to get heavily disappointed at a crucial moment.

There are some really good windlasses on the market currently that do great work. Just don't let them die that slow corrosion death that has been the downfall of so many.

2022 CARIBBEAN

ver 1 million square miles makes the Caribbean Sea fourth in size, after the Pacific, Atlantic, and Indian Oceans. More than 700 islands, reefs, and cays mean it often takes a boat to get around. Not to mention the sheer fun of being on the water. Boatyards throughout the Caribbean offer a full range of services to keep vessels on the water as well as to both service and shelter them during hurricane season. Here's a sampling of what's new at Caribbean boatyards.


TURKS & CAICOS. The Boatyard at South Bank Marina, in Providenciales, Turks & Caicos Islands, is now a dealer for Seakeeper stabilizers. This follows on from the yard's dealerships for Honda and Yamaha engines. "We are doing more concierge services for our clients to enhance their experience with us," says Portia Mogal, operations manager. "When they are ready to use their vessels, we offer the services of launching the vessel, detailing it, fueling it, and stocking the cooler for them. When they return, we wash down the vessel, put it back into storage, and cover it up." The property also has a new restaurant, called Sail Shades. THE DOMINICAN REPUBLIC. Big boats are finding a home for yard work at the IBC Shipyard, in La Romana, at La Marina Casa de Campo. South in St. Croix, there are new yard, marina, and service managers, all ABYC standards certified and USCG licensed,







at the St. Croix Marine Center in Christiansted. There are two Mercury and Yamaha trained technicians too, for outboard and sterndrive. In addition to the 60-ton Marine Travelift, a new 40-ton Marine Travelift TM40 hydraulic transporter will arrive soon. "We are rebuilding another dock this fall to increase slips from 24 to 44," says Christian Herold, yard and marina manager. lanning is the perfect way to have a problem-free haul out. This starts with preparing the vessel for the haul, working with the yard manager on the list of work to be done while on the hard, and choosing a splash date.

HAUL PREPARATION

Make an appointment for a haul out with adequate time to spare and request a quotation of the rates, recommends Donna Samuda Wilson, manager at the Errol Flynn Marina & Boat Yard, in Port Antonio, Jamaica. "Haul-outs generally have several fees attached. As such, it's important to get a sense of the general cost before making the request."

Once fees are squared away and a haul date booked, coordinate with the marina to fully describe your vessel, says Christian Herold, yard and marina manager at the St. Croix Marine Center, on St. Croix, U.S. Virgin Islands. "The individuals taking the boat into the travel lift need to be familiar with the wetted portion of the hull and be prepared to discuss strap

placement with the lift operator, know where any underwater hull obstructions are located, i.e., transducers, fin stabilizers, trim tabs, shaft and keel shape, and location, etc. and articulate those to the operator."

Boats need to be prepared immediately before the haul.

"Boats being stored on land must have all sails and dodgers/ sprayhood removed before the haul. Dinghies must be secured to the foredeck or taken down and stored in the boatyard facility and then will also be tied down. All boats stored for the duration of the season will have the stands welded (standard/lateral) and tied down to ground anchors," explains Lindsay Ralph, boatyard supervisor at the Jolly Harbour Boatyard & Marina, in Jolly Harbour, Antigua.

Be certain that you leave no food on board, including nonperishables, if you want to keep your boat as vermin-free as possible, recommends Hannah Love Thayer, public relations manager for the Virgin Gorda Yacht Harbour (VGYH) Marina and Boatyard, located in Spanish Town, Virgin Gorda. "Leave refrigeration units and cabinets open. If your vessel tends to take on freshwater when it rains, be sure to have a plan to pump out water, whether that be a small pump powered by a battery and solar panel, or an open thru hull."

Once hauled out of the water and securely chocked, the captain should inspect and operate all overboard valves to ensure that they are functioning correctly and freely, advises Jeff Howell, general manager of Mega Yard, in Cole Bay, St. Maarten. "This is the time to address issues such as a stuck valve. Once this has been done, the problem valves can be added to the work list."

YARD WORK

In general, key areas to address when a yacht is out of the water are the steering system, fuel system (fuel tanks), plumbing (waste tanks), electrical grounding and bonding, transmission and controls systems, engine mounts and shaft condition, testing of all valves and thru hulls along the hull, suggests Giovanni Gaudiano, operator of the Shelter Bay Marina's boatyard, in Colon, Panama. "Also, check the hull for any signs of osmosis or premature paint failure."


While on the hard, there should be monthly checks on batteries, an airing out, and a washdown of the vessel, says Sean Devaux, general manager at IGY's Rodney Bay Marina & Boatyard in St. Lucia. "The buildup of Sahara dust over months of storage could cause discoloration in the paint if left for any extended time. In addition, the moisture inside in today's heat could cause mildew, which is why I recommend a monthly opening of windows and doors. Ideally running the AC (if possible) would be best."

LAUNCH TIME

The official dates of storm season in the Caribbean are June 1 to November 30.

"The best time to launch vessels is usually after hurricane sea-









son," says Susan Reece, customer service manager at Peake Yacht Services, in Chaguaramas, Trinidad. "A good polishing and anti-fouling are usually done just before launch, and engines and equipment checked before launch too."

The most common issue with vessels launching after storage is dead batteries, preventing the boat from leaving the haulout pit on time, and delaying the yard schedule for the day, according to VGYH's Thayer. "Be certain all systems are running before launch day. If you are not on island to prepare the vessel yourself, it's a great idea to hire a yacht management service to ensure your vessel is ready to splash."

At launch time, the boat will be picked up by the yard, and the 'chock spots', the areas where the boat was supported, will be lightly sanded and a coat of paint applied in this area. Once it is touch dry the boat will be launched, explains Mega Yard's Howell. "At this time, the captain and crew need to board and do a full inspection of all areas that were worked on. A complete check for water leaks needs to be done quickly before the belts are released from the boat as it is much easier to lift out again if there is a problem. Once checked and found to be fine, the captain can go to his or her next destination."

ne of the most incredible sights in the Caribbean is the beautiful mosaic of blue hues across the sea. It starts with a light turquoise off the beach reflected by the white sand and shallow reefs and moves on to the darker navy of deeper waters offshore. Standing on a hillside or mountain top and looking down is one way to capture this view. Another is by plane, helicopter, and now drone. Drones, technically called unmanned aircraft systems (UAS), are remotely controlled and enjoyed by hobbyists for taking photos. So, it's a no-brainer that since a camera, even a cell phone camera, is a musthave for taking Instagram-worthy photos on vacation, that drones will be next. After all, according to the US's Federal Aviation Administration (FAA), small recreational drones number over a half-million compared to just over half this number for commercial drones.

FLYING ON AN AIRPLANE WITH A DRONE

Some 4.5 million visitors to the Caribbean this year are forecast to arrive by commercial airline, according to Aruba-based Tourism Analytics. Like a camera, drones can be packed in carry-on or checked luggage. The website uavcoach.com recommends getting a special carrying case to protect the drone from damage while traveling, and to make sure the drone is turned off and switches can't be accidentally activated. The bigger issue on airplanes is the batteries. Drone batteries, based on lithium-ion, must go in carry-on bags. And there's a limit based on size. FAA regulations say it's okay to carry as




many drone batteries on a flight as desired if they are under 100 Wh (watt-hours). However, if the batteries are between 101 and 160 Wh, only two are allowed by flight.

DRONE RULES & REGS

When it comes to drones and the rules and regulations for their safe and secure use, there is no one size fits all in the Caribbean. According to David Jessop, former managing director of the UK-based Caribbean Council, writing on the organization's website (www.caribbean-council.org) about the topic, 'Approaches range from a complete ban to wildly different customs interpretations on temporary imports.'

The best bet is to do some homework before traveling to







a specific island. Contact the island's tourism board and/or the island's airport or civil aviation authority. Online sites like www.droneregulations.info/ can be helpful. For example, in Barbados, those who want to fly their drone must obtain authorization ahead of time. The application for this is online at: https://barbados.seamlessdocs.com/sc/uasapplication In the U.S. Virgin Islands, drones are now required to broadcast their location, which means having an ID number that can be crossreferenced with the device's registration number. Additionally, drones are not allowed to fly in national parks like the Virgin Islands National Park on St. John as it may disturb wildlife. In St. Lucia, visitors must declare their drone with Customs and declare that they will return home with the drone as well.

Some general guidelines are good rules of thumb. First, don't fly a drone near an airport. One of the most common distances cited is to stay at least 3- to 4-miles from an airport or aircraft. Secondly, don't fly a drone further than it can be seen, i.e., keep an eye on it. This means no night flying in some places. Third, common sense and respect, suggest not flying a drone over places where people expect privacy. Or, over crowds where if it crashes, it can hurt people.

DRONE PHOTOGRAPHY TIPS

Taking great photographs and video footage by drone isn't



quite as easy as point and shoot. There's a finesse to flying these crafts and practicing before a vacation is wise. That said, many websites offer tips for great shots. One tip is to 'make something out of nothing'. While a huge stretch of the sea might seem beautiful, this image will be even more iconic with something to break up the monotony. Think small island, moored boat, or person on a brightly colored float. Another is using the gesture mode or one that lets an operator command the craft with arm or hand movements, to put the subject smack in the middle. This latter tip is definitely the way to create Caribbean vacation selfies 2.0.

PLANTATION PINEAPPLE RUM -STIGGINS' FANCY

RUM REVIEW BY CLINT AND TERRY BORAM

/e typically steer clear of flavored or infused rums but when we passed a pineapple-infused rum made by Plantation, we knew we had to try it. Alexandre Gabriel, the man behind Plantation, produces rums all over the world using local ingredients. Any Plantation rum we have tried has not let us down so why would we expect anything different here?

Pineapple rum was the drink of choice in 19th century England but like most good things, the love affair came to an end. However, if you're a fan of Charles Dickens' Pickwick Papers you know that pineapple rum was the drink of choice by "esteemed" Reverend Stiggins. "Well esteemed" may have been going overboard. While Rev. Stiggins was preaching temperance to his followers, he was sitting at Mrs. Weller's pub sipping free pineapple rum.

With help from historian David Wondrich, Plantation set out to revive the original cocktail from the early 19th century. Using the 1824 English Journal of Patent and Inventions and the 1844 Journal of Agricultural Society as their main sources, they combined a few traditional techniques they learned along the way, to create a drink worthy of Rev. Stiggins.

Plantation Pineapple Rum is made with ripe Queen Victoria pineapples that are infused into Plantation's Original Dark Rum for 3 months. Once infused, the pineapple rinds are macerated, placed in the rum, and distilled. This bottle was made in Barbados so two columns and pot stills were used. Other distillation sites are Jamaica and Trinidad.

NEAT

A beautiful copper color liquid coats the glass leaving long legs along the sides. The nose is similar to smelling the rind of pineapple to see if it's ripe. Its earthy notes have some raw almonds and hints of pineapple. It's not sweet. The palate gives away its young age; however, once you get past the slight alcohol burn, there are many flavors to explore. The first is butterscotch followed by cloves and bananas. The pineapple comes in late but doesn't dominate the palate. Baking spices



(cinnamon, nutmeg, and cloves) finish this rum in our throat and leaves a very satisfying warmth. We then added an ice cube to help balance the alcohol note. The rum significantly changed creating a hardier mouth feel and opening up the sweetness of the pineapple.

PINEAPPLE DAIQUIRI

2 oz Plantation Pineapple Rum 34 oz fresh lime juice 34 oz simple syrup

Shaken and served in a martini glass.



Wow, this tastes like a completely different rum. The lime really pulls out the pineapple without making it overly sweet. The biggest change is the baking spices. It's reminiscent of a mulled cider.

OVERALL

As Terry finished the daiquiri, Clint consumed more neat. We both enjoyed this infused rum because of how it changes depending on how you sample. At \$35/bottle, Plantation Pineapple Rum is a wonderful rum to sip alone or share as a cocktail with your book club.

SAUCY STIR-FRY WIT

CARIBBEAN COOKING BY CAP'N JAN ROBINSON

MOZZARELLA CHEESE WITH A TASTY TOPPING ON A TOSSED SALAD

Prep time: 15 minutes. Cooking time: 5 minutes. Serves: 4 Note: Serves 4 as an entrée or 8 as a side salad

Salad:

4 cups chopped or torn romaine lettuce 4 cups torn baby spinach 1 small jicama, peeled and cut into thin slices (about 1-1/2 cups) ½ cup chopped walnuts Garnish: Toast 4 slices of bread, cut each in half and 8

Mozzarella Topping:

5 Tbsp. extra virgin olive oil 2 garlic cloves, minced 1/4 tsp. dried crushed red pepper 1 Tbsp. minced fresh oregano Coarse salt and freshly ground black pepper, to taste

cherry tomatoes, slightly roasted

2 Tbsp. capers 12oz. fresh water-packed mozzarella cheese, drained, cut into 3/4-inch-thick slices 1/2 lemon

Heat 2 Tbsp. oil in small skillet over very low heat. Add garlic and crushed pepper and stir just until garlic is fragrant about 3 minutes (remove if garlic starts to turn brown). Remove from heat; stir in oregano, capers, salt, pepper, and remaining oil. Toss salad with balsamic and olive oil or your favorite dressing. Divide the salad ingredients onto individual plates. Place 2 pieces of toast on each salad and top with cheese, along with 2 roasted tomatoes. Spoon Mozzarella Topping over cheese slices and finish with a squeeze of lemon juice.

BRUSSELS SPROUTS AT THEIR BEST

Prep time: 10 minutes. Marinating time: overnight. Serves: 4 or more 1 lb. Brussels sprouts, cut in half or quartered Juice of 1 lemon 1 Tbsp. olive oil Garlic salt, paprika, and pepper, to taste

In a gallon size ziploc bag, combine the lemon juice, olive oil, paprika, garlic salt, and pepper. Add in the Brussels, seal bag and toss around, until well coated. Refrigerate overnight. When ready to roast, preheat oven to 400°F, remove Brussels from bag and place in a single layer on a baking sheet and bake for 15-20 minutes. HINT: I like mine crispy. Feel free to eat the whole pan or share



SAUCY RICE STIR-FRY

Prep time: 15 minutes. Cooking time: 15 minutes. Serves: 4

Sauce:

1 cup tamari or soy sauce 3 clove garlic, minced 1 cup vegetable stock 1-1/2 Tbsp. grated ginger 4 Tbsp. rice vinegar 2 Tbsp. arrowroot starch 2 tsp. agave nectar or 1 tsp. red pepper flakes pure maple syrup

Stir-fry:

4 Tbsp. grapeseed oil 12 oz. mixed shitake and portobello mushrooms, sliced 2 cups broccoli florets

1 cup frozen peas 4 cups cooked wild rice 5 green onions, sliced

In a bowl, mix together the sauce ingredients and set aside. Heat the grapeseed oil in a stir-fry pan over medium-high heat. Add the mushrooms, broccoli florets, and frozen peas; cook and stir for about 5 minutes. Add the sauce and cook for about 2 more minutes or until the sauce starts to thicken. Add the rice and green onions: stir for another minute or so. Serve and heat hot.

QUICK PARFAIT

Prep time: 10 minutes. Serves: 4

2 cups frozen strawberries 1 cup raw cashews 1/3 cup pure maple syrup

2 tsp. pure vanilla extract 2 cups vegan granola **Garnish:** Pomegranate seeds
