





#### TO CONSERVE CORAL REEFS

It's one thing to see, and yet another to commit to saving coral reefs. The latter is what Bajío, producer of blue-light filtering, sustainably made, performance sunglasses did in August when the company kicked off its Temples of Change campaign. The New Smyrna Beach, Florida-based shades maker teamed with Oceanus, A.C., a non-profit organization based in Quintana Roo, Mexico, that develops projects for coral reef conservation, and artist and fisheries biologist, Piper Nunn, to help save the coral reefs of Xcalak, Mexico, in the Western Caribbean.

"In Xcalak, The Great Mayan Reef is only a few hundred yards from the beach and is a critical part of the habitat we fish. A healthy reef means a healthy fish population, so we want to do our part to protect and renew it," said Al Perkinson, founder of Bajío Sunglasses.

The Oceanus, A.C.-developed coral restoration program that Bajío is using for Temples of Change includes the construction of coral nurseries and the transplantation of thousands of colonies a year. To fund this, every purchase of the limitededition Nata Permit Tail or Balam Coral Reef frames from Bajío's newly launched Temples of Change collection results in a \$20 donation to Oceanus, A.C., and one coral colony is planted and maintained. Each coral will grow up to five square meters, helping to restore vital ocean populations critical for fish habitat. www.bajiosunglasses.com




#### **ZF MARINE HIRES NEW HEAD OF PRODUCT** LINE COMMERCIAL-FAST CRAFT

Vivid photos reveal an entire world of life that is hidden in the sargassum, from microscopic sea creatures to birds that have learned to hunt and forage in it. 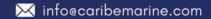
"Interesting things in the book for sea-oriented folks are the mechanics of how the sargassum started coming here and why it comes back each year. Also, the marine life that lives on and around it. We're still learning about the ecology of this tropical sargassum, so anyone on the water could make important observations about how it is being used by fish and birds," says Yokoyama.

#### **NOVEMBER 5: SXM Wahoo Tournament.**




#### **NOVEMBER 8 – 11: Fall Charter Yacht Show.**



And the increasingly vocal incels blame all this on, of course, on any woman with enough criteria not to sleep with them!?!


Why bother getting (it or yourself) up?


Now, suddenly, all of that's in doubt.




challenge any experienced boater to say they've never had a ditsy, dangerous or close to drowning moment in their dinghies. And inevitably you are in full view of a crowded anchorage or marina full of gleeful watchers as you execute a truly stupid move. However, it may be preferable to have a bad dinghy day within sight of human rescue than way offshore.

BE HONEST NOW, HAVE YOU EVER -

**Gone round and round in circles** because you let the tiller handle of your outboard go and it swung out of reach developing a mind of its own?

**Left your dinghy unattended** on a dock during a huge downpour/big tidal change, or at the mercy of those using it as a steppingstone to get across to their own transport? And there is no recourse for flooding, entrapment or saltwater engine damage that ensues.

Lost your cell phone in the dinghy and found it two years later-



during which time it has been trapped under the seat and morphing into flaky layers?

**Bought a second-hand inflatable** that has been in storage for years to save a few bucks – only to find that after you launch air is escaping from a hundred pinholes faster than can be pumped back in?



**Threatened to put someone in the dinghy** and until the painter - bad dog/child/crew member/first mate/guest from hell?

**Drowned the dinghy?** An easy way to do this with a hard dinghy is to lose your balance, step on the gunwale, and hang on too long when alighting from the mother ship.

Had a large fish land in your dinghy and thrash around violently, snapping at ankles and toes with bloody results. Crew depart overboard for self-preservation.

**Had a dinghy stolen while onboard?** Late one night we were chatting down below when a swimmer silently untied and



towed ours away - and how can you chase after him without your dinghy?

Forgotten to put the bung in - only realising this as your crew/charter guests step into rising water? On our first 36foot yacht the baby stay prevented the dinghy from fitting on the foredeck, so a hole was made to pass the stay through the dinghy when stored while sailing. A cap sealed it before launching - provided we did not forget to screw it in.

Overloaded the dinghy to the point of no return? Racing in the live aboard class in Tobago our hard dinghy was left on the buoyed anchor precariously loaded with spare anchors, chain, water bottles, canvas, rope and cat litter - heavy stuff that was obviously stopping us from winning!

Towed a large, wooden dinghy between islands in a big following sea? When we did this, waves kept slamming it into the transom eventually breaking the bridle. We then tried to get it on deck without major damage to ourselves or our yacht as it swung in and out from the toe rail at great velocity. We were forced to let the dinghy go altogether rather than lose a leg or bash a hole in the hull.

Misjudged the speed of an oncoming vessel as you slowly row or putt-putt along with your tiny outboard across the path of a fast powerboat or massive cruise ship? To add to the danger your flashlight batteries are flat, or worse still, you did not bring a light as you weren't intending to stay ashore beyond sunset.



#### Put an overly powerful engine onto a tiny, light dinghy?

The buyer of our first yacht did this and thought a heavy crew member in the bow would balance things. Luckily, we managed to change his mind before they left the dock.

Ended up drifting helplessly in the wrong direction? A vachtie once left a lively party in Trinidad, fell asleep in his dinghy, lost one oar, and drifted for days to the coast of Venezuela, where thankfully the coast guard picked him up.

Almost destroyed your dinghy while maneuvering in a tight space? Reversing out of a marina we lost sight of our dinghy tied alongside. Sandwiched between our heavy displacement boat and the mooring pile, it folded into half its width before popping out when pressure reduced. Remarkably, because it was an almost indestructible injection moulded plastic Walker Bay dinghy, it returned to normal shape and functioned perfectly for years.

Rescued your dinghy when the knot you thought you tied correctly somehow came undone? The skipper dived in clothes and all and swim a marathon in the dark as the little boat swiftly disappeared towards the open sea. When he did not reappear after a very long time, I raised the alarm. The cruising friend who kindly came over to assist (just as exhausted skipper and wayward dinghy reappeared) had only one comment: "Silly bugger!" And I totally agreed. The Trini rigging team my husband worked with used to say: "Tie the knot loose – meaning untie it." Makes sense, doesn't it? If you can tie it tight, you should be able to tie it loose, so that must have been what inadvertently happened.




Swum back to your boat towing your inflatable as other means of propulsion weren't working? Feisty single hander on her yacht Lady Charli did just that in her seventies, but wisely warned us to "never say never" when laughing at other sailors' mishaps.

Those new to cruising have many of these adventures yet to come, but not all are dire or dismal. Look forward to lively dinghy concerts and sunset raft ups, exploring colourful reefs, and discovering astonishing fauna and flora up the narrow "canos" of giant rivers. 0



ightning is defined as 'a naturally occurring electrostatic discharge during which two electrically charged regions in the atmosphere or ground temporarily equalize themselves, causing the instantaneous release of as much as one gigajoule of energy.'

**QUICK FACTS:** 

Lightning strikes are commonplace as are opinions on protecting your property from damage. Signs of a strike can range from a minor blemish to sinking. Research shows your chances of a lightning strike are about one in a thousand. The further South you are, the greater the likelihood of a strike. Sailboats are more attractive than powerboats, but powerboats are not immune.

There are gizmos you can install on your yacht. Some do better than others. Ask around. Lightning is unpredictable and there is no guarantee your solution will keep lightning away or divert it to the boat in the next slip.

The American Boat & Yacht Council (ABYC) has standards to reduce lightning damage. Check out www.abycinc.org for more information. The idea is to get the charge to ground quickly. A minimum resistance, direct path is preferable.

Sailboats particularly and power boats occasionally may be affected by nearby strikes. We have seen claims where a boat several slips away was hit and neighborhood boats were damaged by the pulse or stray current.


You may not be immediately aware Zeus, the Greek god of lightning, has visited. His calling card could include electrical, electronic, or mechanical equipment malfunction or unexplained whiskey compass inaccuracy. Or bits of masthead gear are found on deck or have vanished.

Whatever the clue, to prevent sinking, you must check your bilge pumps and battery chargers to ensure they are functioning properly. If you are connected to shore power, examine the connection for signs of damage.

Lightning claims are straightforward. Address immediate concerns to save your boat. Emergency repairs should be done to ensure she stays afloat. If you are taking on water, haul your boat or plug the leak and monitor bilge water levels. Report the event to your insurer as soon as possible. Obtain written estimates to repair the damages and submit them to your representative. If you paid emergency repair costs, get a written receipt, and present it with your claim.

After repairs are complete and your yacht is seaworthy, do a sea trial and vigorously exercise all equipment to ensure all claim issues have been addressed.

## PRACTICAL PROVISIONING:

## Tips for Before, During & After Passage to the Caribbean

here are no service center stops with fast food outlets or small towns with restaurants on the waterway highway from the U.S. or Europe to the Caribbean. Plus, supermarkets on the islands don't have the selection or same brands as on the mainland. That's what makes provisioning well before you cast off so important.

Overall, "my biggest piece of advice is to have food that you and your crew enjoy and will eat. A well-fed crew is a great asset and provides something that everyone looks forward to. I query the crew beforehand as to their dietary preferences and try to make sure I include that in my provisioning. I provision based on two different scenarios. The first is while on passage and the second is essentials during our time in the islands," Jo Ella Barnes, secretary of the Salty Dawg Sailing Association's (SDSA) board of directors and longtime cruiser aboard the Hallberg-Rassy 43, Starburst.

#### **BEFORE PASSAGE-MAKING**

A good rule of thumb is to provision 1.5 times the number of passage days, according to the SDSA-written pamphlet, Provisioning for a Happy Passage. For example, this translates to 15 dinners for a 10-day passage. As for a timeline, buy non-refrigerated food items, toiletries, cleaning supplies, food wraps, etc., weeks or months before departure. The week before, stock up on ingredients for pre-planned meals and frozen foods. Lastly, buy fresh foods the day before casting off.

"We will visit the market in Las Palmas for fresh produce, oranges, green tomatoes, bananas, onions, etc.," says Kathryn Taylor, who will be sailing the ARC 2022 aboard the Beneteau 411, Pelagria. "White Bimbo brand bread may not look very appealing, but it does last for weeks. We also take flour for bread making but need to balance up against the use of gas.

Before a rally, Barnes spends time in her kitchen at home preparing and freezing meals. "These are the main meals of the day. This is for several reasons. It is easy to heat a meal. And, if the chef is down or the seas are extremely high, there is no food prep necessary. You can still have a hot meal. You can lay out your meals for several days without having to decide what to have that day. And, even if you catch a big fish and have fresh fish during the trip, those frozen meals are still available if needed."

Some cruisers like Bob Osborn, SDSA president who with his wife Brenda sail their Aerodyne 47, Pandora, prefer not to preprep and freeze dinners. "I don't generally do that as it means running the oven a lot and that heats up the boat. I tend to prepare for the first 4 to 5 days in that way, but after that, it's simple pasta, meatballs, chicken and I make it up as I go."

Still, others do a bit of both. "For the first night out, I pack a family-size frozen lasagna to put in the oven, along with two loaves of garlic bread. "Beyond that, my wife 'volunteers' to make meatloaf and chicken cutlets so it is heat-andserve," says Hank Schmitt, founder of the North American Rally to the Caribbean (NARC), and chief executive officer of Offshore Passage Opportunities. "Another thing I pack is Zatarain's box Jambalaya or Etouffee meals. Three boxes





feed six hungry people. All the spices and rice are in one box. Throw in anything else you need. A good one pot meal to make underway."

Storage is the most important thing during the pre-rally stage, says Carlota Texeira, who handles public relations for the Viking Explorers rally. "Know which items can be stored together and which will not make the food last longer. For example, potatoes and onions can't be stored together. Another good tip is to put bay leaves in the Tupperware of the rice and pasta to prevent the appearance of insects. Also recommended is to wash every piece of fruit and vegetables before bringing it on board to avoid insects."

#### **MEAL-MAKING AT SEA**

Some of the things that are important to have on passage are oatmeal for an easy and filling breakfast, saltines to ease the stomach in case of seasickness, a favorite electrolyte powder (for example, Gatorade) to add to water again for seasickness, rice for stir-fries and to eat for upset stomachs, and oranges and apples for snacking and kept out of the refrigerator, recommends Barnes. "Have treats that your crew will like. I keep a big box of all types of things that the crew can access whenever they want. It contains everything from granola, nuts, and ginger candy, to crackers."

Grilled cheese sandwiches are easy to make and sit in the belly well, suggests the NARC's Schmitt. "Same for Pan-

cakes. Hot dogs are easy to boil and serve."

There are lots of ways to dress up a soup with extra meat to make it different, adds the SDSA's Osborn. "Eggs are a great way to prepare interesting meals. Nothing like an egg sandwich. I also use lots of cold cuts, canned tuna, and chicken."

"We always fish on our trips, so fresh fish is always a treat," says Barnes. "I keep lime juice around to make ceviche which is always enjoyed by everyone."


#### ON ARRIVAL & CRUISING THE CARIBBEAN


Fresh food such as meat, vegetables, and fruits are the first things needed on arrival to the Caribbean, according to Viking Explorer's Texeira. "We arrive in Grenada, and you can find almost everything at the main supermarkets like Foodland and IGA. But, of course, the prices are higher as most items are imported from the U.S."

Depending on what island she's on determines where Barnes shops. "For example, in Dominica, there are wonderful fresh produce vendors to restock your vegetable supply. The French islands have wonderful bakeries for fresh bread and pastries. Antigua has several supermarkets with many carrying gourmet items. You usually won't have as many choices or find the same brands as you do in the U.S. But remember, this is a fun trip and part of the fun is experiencing the ambiance of each country and its food."











## CARÚPANO 12-YEAR OLD -VENEZUELA

RUM REVIEW

henever we pick up an opaque bottle of rum, we wonder, "What are they hiding?" Part of the experience of tasting an aged rum is noticing the color the aging process gives the rum. For a 12-year-old, we hope to see no lighter than an amber hue, displaying all the glory the oak barrel can give a rum. Let's hope this Ron Anejo Carúpano 12-year-old wasn't hiding its age.

Ron Carúpano was founded in the Macarapano Valley of Venezuela in 1762 by Spanish captain Félix del Fierro. The hacienda on the farm soon became known as Hacienda Altamira-Carúpano. By 1889, the rum produced at the hacienda was receiving acclaim and winning medals abroad. But it was in 1896 that the key ingredient in their rum-making process, the pure spring waters in the Chuare River, became exclusive to the owners of Hacienda Altamira. The spring water ensures the greatest purity against any undesirable odors or flavors in the rum.

Today, Distileeria Carúpano produces a molasses-based rum using column stills. The rum is aged onsite in a microclimate created by the high degree of humidity from the Caribbean Sea breezes and the high air temperatures. This unique microclimate helps to accelerate, optimize and intensify the rum as it ages. Ron Anejo Carúpano 12-year-old is aged in white American Oak barrels "without replacement



of annual angel's share and special reserve of up to 12 years" indicating this is a single barrel aging process.

#### **HE SAID**

The nose has a slight hint of orange with oak, dark cherry, and a rich earthiness. The earthiness reminds me of walking in a forest post rain. There is a slight alcohol burn that hits my eyes while I'm enjoying the aroma. The palate is very pleasant with a strong oak note followed by very subtle orange zest and dark cherry. That earthiness is still on the palate but dissipates on the finish. The finish is short, with florals and orange zest. This is a very nice 12-year-old.

For a 12-year-old, we hope to see no lighter than an amber hue, displaying all the glory the oak barrel can give a rum. Let's hope this Ron Anejo Carúpano 12-year-old wasn't hiding its age.

#### **SHE SAID**

The amber color hugs the glass providing plump, lazy lacing. The nose is sweet with vanilla, orange, and caramel. The liquid has a hearty mouth feel that is subtle at first then explodes on my tongue. The notes of vanilla, almond, and caramel quickly give way to a citric burst of orange peel creating a tingling on my tongue and the back of my palate. Then, just like that, the notes dissipate leaving no lingering notes to contemplate. I go back for more, looking for the notes on the nose but all I get is orange peel.

#### **OVERALL**

Clint likes Ron Anejo Carúpano 12-year-old but wishes it finished a little better. Terry likes the idea of this rum but feels the orange peel is overpowering. At \$36/bottle, it's a good rum to debate with friends over your individual experiences.

ushrooms are a fungus, but they are also very good for us. Mushrooms bring a savory flavor to meals without adding much fat, calories or sodium. The health benefits don't stop there. Researchers continue to uncover how mushrooms can ward off chronic disease and improve your everyday health. It is also true that functional mushrooms, like maitake and shiitake, have been found to increase energy and lower stress. Here are some of our favorite healthy mushroom recipes.

#### **CRISPY MUSHROOMS WITH CREAMY** WHITE BEANS AND KALE

Prep time: 10 minutes. Cooking time: 15 minutes. Serves: 2

6 Tbsp. extra-virgin olive oil, divided

4 oz. maitake mushrooms, broken into large pieces

4 oz. shitake mushrooms, but into 1/2" slices

Kosher Salt

1 (14.5 oz) can cannellini beans, rinsed, drained

2 Tbsp. fresh lime juice, plus wedges for serving

4 medium size garlic cloves, divided

4 scallions, cut into 1" pieces

1 bunch kale, center ribs and stems removed, leaves torn

1 Tbsp. toasted sesame seeds or pine nuts

1 cup cilantro leaves

In a large skillet over medium-high heat, add mushrooms and cook about 4 minutes, toss and cook other side until browned and crispy about another 3 minutes. Transfer to a warm plate and season with salt. Meanwhile, purée beans, lime juice, 3 Tbsp oil, 2 garlic cloves, and 3 Tbsp. water in a blender until smooth, adding more water by the Tbsp. as needed to loosen mixture. Season. Heat 1 Tbsp. oil in same skillet over medium-high. Add scallions and remaining garlic. Cook, tossing, until just beginning to brown, about 1 minute. Add kale and cook, tossing often until wilted and crisp tender, about 3 minutes. Transfer to plate with mushrooms. Divide bean purée between bowls. Top with greens, mushrooms, sesame seeds, and cilantro. Serve with lime wedges.

#### **ROASTED MUSHROOMS WITH THYME** AND SMOKED SALT

Prep time: 5 minutes. Cooking time: 10 minutes

Cooling time: 10 minutes. Serves: 4

1 lb. assorted mushrooms, cleaned of dirt

2 Tbsp. EVOO

2 cloves garlic, smashed

2 sprigs thyme



#### Kosher salt

1 Tbsp. ghee (or salted butter)

1 Tbsp apple cider vinegar

2 Tbsp. grainy Dijon mustard, optional

1 tsp. dried thyme

Chop the mushrooms into 1-2 inch pieces and if small, leave them whole. Heat a large cast iron pan over medium-high heat. Add olive oil, garlic, and thyme and cook for one minute to flavor the oil. Add mushrooms stir and leave for a minute. Proceed to cook until caramelized. Do not overcrowd pan. Cool about 10 minutes. Season with salt and stir. Add butter, vinegar, and mustard. Stir and let reduce for one minute. Serve immediately.

#### THAI COCONUT MUSHROOM SOUP

1 (13 oz) can coconut milk

4 cups of vegetable stock

3 pieces root end lemongrass (bottom 3 inches) bruised

6 oz. white button mushrooms, sliced

½ cup chopped cilantro

2 Tbsp. lime juice.

In a medium sized bot, put the coconut milk, vegetable stock, and bruised lemongrass and simmer over medium-low heat for about 15 minutes, until the liquid is infused with the lemongrass flavor. Remove the lemongrass and discard. Add the mushrooms and cook for another 5 minutes, until just softened. Remove from heat and stir in the cilantro and lime juice. NOTE: You can store mushrooms in a loosely closed brown paper bag in the fridge, where they should stay fresh about a week.
