

#### **GRENADA NAMED 2023 'YACHTING DESTINATION** OF THE YEAR' IN CARIBBEAN TRAVEL AWARDS

Celebrated for years for its spice production, the Southern Caribbean island of Grenada now has a new claim to fame: 'Yachting Destination of the Year' for 2023. Caribbean Journal (CJ), the world's largest website covering the region's travel and trade news, awarded the island this honor. Reasons include the outstanding facilities of Camper & Nicholson's Port Louis Marina and charter bases like The Moorings here too. Plus, CJ notes that the tri-island nature of Grenada, along with its offshore island of Carriacou and Petite Martinique, plus its proximity to the Grenadines make it a perfect hub to explore by sea. Jolly Harbor was 40 minutes away from Antigua's yachting hub back in 1993. However, the site made Budget Marine history as the locale of the first store outside of the company's founding in St. Maarten. Isleta Marina has been in business for approximately thirtyeight years and includes several facilities with 240 wet slips, a boatyard offering repair facilities, a slipway, and a lift, as well as a sailmaker, a restaurant, and a marine store.






#### **BVI Spring Regatta & Sailing Festival.**

esterday, somewhere in the world, nine one-design sailors raced each other. A guy named Pete won. Whew! Writing such scintillating sports copy really takes it out of a marine journalist!

Which begs the question: why cover one yacht race over another? And what, exactly, is the future of yacht racing at its most exalted level? Which modern regatta is truly 'sailing into the future?'

Does anyone care about those nine guys flogging their windblown vessels around a short, 15-minute race course?

Good question.

Here's another one—why did SAIL GP even stage a regatta on January 14-15 in Singapore—a country that knows almost nothing about yacht racing, and cares less?

Answer: F1 auto racing.

That's it—that's the key to all this F50 madness in Asia. Singapore feels that it 'put itself on the sports map' with F1 Grand Prix auto racing and has managed to leverage a lot of money and international prestige from the relatively few pennies invested. I have sat through numerous meetings with the movers and shakers of the Miracle of Singapore and this is a core belief they have: The pennies they invested in F1 racing paid off handsomely for their people.

Fine. SAIL GP wants to be the greener F1 and Singapore needs the Next Big Thing. A three-year contract was signed. Yacht racing and public money are mingling in new and exotic ways.

And in what better venue than ultra-modern, ultra-efficient Singapore?

Why should readers of ALL AT SEA care? Well, one reason is that SAIL GP and a fellow named David Palmer and his Bernoulli-Locke DAO (a decentralized autonomous organization) have combined with NEAR (who are involved in cyber security and will tell you more if you just send them your email address) are unexpectedly soliciting money while mentioning the Caribbean region. Huh? Money for what? How? Why?

Frankly, I'm not sure. To buy an F50? To sponsor a regatta? To purchase the whole SAIL GP organization? Strangely, after two intense days of covering SAIL GP, I'm more confused about who is paying whom for what—than ever.

As a yacht race, SAIL GP is succeeding brilliantly. I, personally, enjoy watching each and every event on the Internet—and have since its inception. But Russel Coutts and Larry Ellison two odd bedfellows if ever there were—have cooked up a strange, strange brew to compete with the American's Cup.

Let's take an in-depth look.

SAIL GP is part yacht race, part eco-cult, and part educational—a holy trinity that combines in odd and unusual ways. The question is: what does yacht racing have to do with DAOs and NFTs? Is SAIL GP 'sailing into the future' as it claims or merely currently obscuring its financial present?

Here's the good, the bad, and the ugly.

In many ways, SAIL GP has a greater eco-focus than any other yachting event in the world. It's in their very slogan—"Powered by Nature." Part of this emphasis is because public funds of the host countries are involved, I assume. And, yes, the F50 boats are powered by the wind, as sailboats are—even the F50's lithium batteries are solar-charged. Fantastic! Admirable! Amazing!

What isn't solar-powered or 'carbon-positive' are the 300 people that the event jets around the world each month, the 100 containers it moves, or the 30 vessels (most with twin 300hp outboards) it ships.

Which isn't to say SAIL GP isn't doing good things in the ecosphere. It is. However, it might be laying on the greenwash a bit too thick.







There were times being in its Media Center was like watching Patrick McGoohan's TV show The Prisoner being crosspollinated with a yacht race. I knew the Truth was Out There somewhere; but where?

According to press releases, there's really two races going on during a SAIL GP event—both equally important.

One competition is to save the planet while conserving carbon, with prizes of "upwards of \$100,000!" for the crews. They refer to it as the 'Second Podium,' the Podium for the Planet! There's even an Impact League leaderboard. And a huge (recycled carbon fiber, natch) trophy.

Right now, as of January 15 at the close of racing in Singapore, Team Canada is winning with 1074 points, NZ second with 1072, and Denmark holding third at 1069. Cool, eh?

Another eco-prize: the Golden Crane ticket (which allows the boat's team to skip to the head of the line after the event). Even better, individual crews can solicit their own ecosponsors—more ways to raise more funds!

Everywhere the focus is on the environment (and fundraising). But often the SAIL GP clearly overreaches. I couldn't help but smile when an earnest young spokesperson told me that "no plastic is allowed in the Tech Area" where the boats are kept and worked on.

Hell, the boats are frig'n plastic! Everything is plastic, plastic, and more plastic! (What the spokesperson perhaps meant to say was, "SAIL GP discourages the use of one-use plastic bottles on its premises."

This is true. And this is admirable. And, yes, I rode my bike 1.5 hours each way to the event because I, too, care about Planet Earth.

Perhaps I should seek sponsorship?

Does SAIL GP really expect me to believe that if a millionaire named Russell and a billionaire named Larry, jet 300 people around the world every month and ship 30+ boats/engines and 100+ containers—that Singapore or our planet's ecoproblems will be less?

That's what they're selling—at least in the Media room.

Gee, maybe what we need is 100 billionaires flying 30,000 people and shipping 10,000 containers and 3,000 yachts around the world to race in exotic locales—and we could cool the planet and solve world hunger too!

Please don't misunderstand me. I want to repeat my previous statement: I've never attended a yacht race with a greater emphasis on the environment than the recent SAIL GP event in S'pore. And that's good. And to be commended.

But, alas, we must remain reality-based.

There's a difference between massive PR spin and actual solar power.

Why am I making such a big deal about this? For one simple reason: *SAIL GP makes a big deal of this.* As a sailor, I'm primarily interested in boats-moving-through-the-water. SAIL GP constantly conflates this simple act of eco-babble. Or am I being too harsh?

While I was there, a sailor attached a flag to a shroud with some wire ties—as a few of his fellow sailors cringed. Moments later, a different sailor replaced those bits of one-use plastic with some biodegradable waxed linen twine.

"Renewable," he said.

Laughable? Or a first baby step towards a better world?

I'll leave that for you, dear reader, to decide.

One thing that I do know about is the Singapore government. It wants real-world results; they can spot BS a mile away.

On the positive side, I really *didn't* see any plastic bottles on the Tech site and the chilled water refill stations (BYOB) were plentiful. Hooray!

Even better, SAIL GP has won the 2022 BBC Green Sports Award—the Ambitious and Impact Award.

They also won three gold medals in the UN Climate Neutral Now Initiative.

As mentioned, there is also a Youth Educational Component to SAIL GP. It is in its infancy. While at the Tech Site, I did, indeed, see two dozen Singaporean youngsters in a couple of small tents being taught something.

Again, admirable—or, at least, embryonically so.

Singapore has the highest, most incredible, most respected education system on this planet. And when they eventually



evaluate the SAIL GP educational program, they'll instantly be able to determine whether it is BS or not.

Now we come to the sickly, disconcerting part.

I'm a 71-year-old sailor who has lived aboard for 63 years and raced throughout the world over the course of my four circs. I like to think I'm a tolerant fellow, willing to change, and learn new things. But recently the SAIL GP team contacted me (and the general public) in evident partnership with Bernoulli-Locke (NEAR) which is a DAO (a decentralized Autonomous Organization) from which I'd be able to (lucky me!) purchase tokens from a Mister David Palmer.

Huh?

They want to sell me tokens? How, exactly, does blockchain factor in? And why is this a Caribbean Team? Has Bermuda been towed to the Caribbean?

What is going on here? What does any of this have to do with vacht racing?

I read much of their Palmer's prospectus—word salad! Especially





the part about the Earth Day posters and downloading a NEAR digital wallet. And the fact that the first 20 lucky, lucky people to buy their NFTs will get t-shirts, real sustainably-made t-shirts!

How could anyone pass that up?

Why does any of the above matter? Because I think Russell and Larry might be accomplishing their goals. They might actually be succeeding where the early Formula 40s in the 1980s and the Extreme 40s recently failed. Why do I say that?

Because, in America at least, SAIL GP is beginning to get more clicks than F1 auto racing after an event—depending, of course, on what metric you're measuring.

This totally bowled me over.

If so, hats off to SAIL GP!

Once I was able to set aside such PR/financial questions, I was enthralled with SAIL GP. Example: Each vessel is always continuously reporting 2,400 data points to the organization. That's not what blew me away. The fact that any crew can analyze that data at any time for as long as they want did. If all nine boats do something while racing or during practice—and one boat does it notably better, then everyone can learn from it equally.

With data, audio, and visual.

This is a very new, very utopian idea to me.

This may mean that all the top foiling sailors in the world end up being SAIL GP-bred.

Also, the umpires are not on the water—not even on site!

Interestingly, in almost all the regattas I've covered, the international judges are totally transparent—their organizations, names, monetary pay, and personal motives. Not here. Who are they? Where are they? Who pays them? Why do they do it? How do they do it?

I haven't quite got my head around this aspect yet—or the entrance fee (or financial commitment) of (whisper, it isn't officially released) a rumored 14 million per boat. Huh?

"We realize that we must come up with money," the French skipper told me. What money? Why? For whom?

Japan just lost a sponsor so—hey, they're out!

But the idea among SAIL GP organizers seems to be that all these money/motivation questions aren't important. Who cares? Relax, dude! Nobody asks the F1 people these things, do they?



Just as the average F1 auto fans don't know how to fix their cars—why should yacht racing be any different?

Should questions like this even be asked? I'm not sure—but I think so. Isn't it my job and the job of small marine publications around the world to ask exactly such questions?

One thing I am 100% supportive of is the SAIL GP's Woman's Pathway Program. It has resulted in this rule change: each vessel must have a female member of the crew in order to race.

That's big—and, in my view, highly admirable. There is no reason why the winning skipper of SAIL GP or the America's Cup can't be a female soon... IF they have the same opportunities to learn. SAIL GP has taken the lead in this, and hooray for them.

Another interesting factoid—all crewmembers must wear helmets and a life vest—which includes a knife and 8 minutes of air.

This makes sense with boats zooming along at 60 mph boats that can (and did) kill a crewmember by trapping them under the trampoline.

Another interesting development or change: Extreme 40s practically arranged for vessels to collide in front of their cameras. SAIL GP is taking the opposite approach by severely penalizing the slightest contact. And the contact doesn't have to be during an official race—practices and training sessions count too.

Okay! To the Race Coverage!

Singapore is a light-air venue. Heading into this regatta we only knew one thing: that because of a penalty imposed during practice, Pete Burling of New Zealand was down four points before the start—and thus at a severe disadvantage.

There were five races.

The first race was postponed due to lack of air. Only two fleet races were conducted on Saturday: two on Sunday, plus the final winner-take-all three-boat race on Sunday as well.

Who won? Pete Burling of Team New Zealand dazzled—despite beginning with the above-mentioned deficit of minus four points. How/why? Because his crew was nearly flawless. And because, during a squall in the final race, he was best able to control his over-powered vessel in the momentarily strong winds.

Why did Aussie Tom Slingsby lose? Because during the final he allowed his vessel to fall off its foils during a slow (decreasing-wind) mark rounding.

Racing is, at this level, a search for perfection.

Nicolai Sehested of Denmark was in the final hunt but couldn't 'shift gears' during the shifty (erratically increasing and decreasing) winds of the final race.

Sadly, the aggressive Jimmy Spithill of USA Oracle was over the starting line early twice during the regatta. Ouch!

Ben Ainslie and Team Great Britain seemed jet-lagged. I realize that's an odd thing to say but it is true. Ben seemed like he was drowning in the confusion of his too-full, too hectic life.

I watched him doing a sponsor photo-shoot on the beach. The poor guy wanted to scream but could only patiently smile. Switzerland, Canada, France, and Spain are all at different stages of their learning process.

Here's the bottom line: SAIL GP is working harder and more creatively than any other group to redefine yacht racing in the Internet age. To ignore them is to ignore the future, for better or worse. (end) 0





or the last 11 years I have run crewed charters aboard Guiding Light, a Lagoon 410, in the Virgin Islands with several years down in the Leeward and Windward Islands. This year I decided it was time to point the bows westward, to see new cruising grounds, and my girlfriend, Lily, and I did just that in February 2022. Our first cruising ground would be the southern coast of Puerto Rico. I am sure many of you are wondering why we skipped the amazing islands of Culebra and Vieques along with the east coast of Puerto Rico. Simply put, I have spent months over the last decade in the Spanish Virgin Islands and I wanted to go somewhere new. Plus we had a wonderful surprise pop up a week or two before. Lily's daughters (age 27 & 21) would be joining us for 10 days.

We sailed the 40+ miles from St Thomas to Palmas Del Mar Marina in order to leave the boat secured while we drove a rental car to San Juan to pick the girls up. Having spent some time in Puerto Rico each year I hauled the boat out over a six year period, I knew I must show them Old San Juan and El Yunque rain forest. Both were major hits and well worth the three days we spent away from the boat, but it was time to get back aboard and set sail.

We left on their fourth morning and raised the spinnaker for a fast 30 mile run to Bahia de Jobos and topped it off by entering the bay at the eastern entrance called Boca del Infierno (Mouth of Hell in English) in 25 knots of wind. Despite the ominous name I was not that worried because it was supposed to be a fairly well defined gap in the reef and if I did not think it was safe to enter we would just go another five miles and enter the bay on the leeward side of the reef. Turns out it was no big deal even in the high winds and we anchored between the mangrove islands just to the east, which turned out to be right next to Cayo Caribe State Park. Everyone loved exploring all



the different mangrove channels between the islands with the dinghy and going ashore to walk around the park was a hit also.

Bahia de Jobos is a huge five mile long bay that is very well protected and offers many different anchoring opportunities. I would have loved to spend more time exploring the entire bay, but we had limited time with the girls and needed to move on. With that said we set sail for Cayos de Ratones at the west end of the bay. My guide book said this was a very protected little anchorage, but when we got there it was filled with local boats all tied stern to the mangroves (this is the way most Puerto Rican captains prefer to anchor), so we pressed on for another four miles until we came to Cayos de Caracoles. I am going to admit there are not a lot of reasons to stop here. The main reason we did is because we were running out of daylight and the girls wanted a beach....even if it was only the tiny one on the northwest end of the cay.

The next morning was a leisurely pancake breakfast before we moved a whopping two and a half miles to the town of Santa Isabel. By the time we arrived the winds were blowing a good 25 knots, so it was very nice to be in the amazingly protected little creek like bay. I am not sure you can take much more than a 6 foot draft over the bar at the entrance, but once inside we anchored in a line with the local boats. If you stray too much out of the line of anchored boats you will be on the shoals to either side. Before going ashore to walk around town and grab a drink we decided to check out the two little beaches on the other side of the anchorage. Turns out the shallow sandbar going from one beach to the other was actually a sandy layer over a black mud that squished between your toes. Having three women with me, I was not the hero for taking them there. Haha.

Lucky for me our next stop was Isla Caja de Muertos (Coffin Island) 8-9 miles to the southwest. This island was owned by Tito Wirshing "back in the day" and island lore says he threw some legendary parties. Once he passed away, it was gifted to the Ponce Yacht Club and is now part of the PR Parks Department. It used to be a major tourist destination for day tripping Puerto Ricans, but it was destroyed by Hurricane Maria in 2017 and has not reopened. That meant we had the island to ourselves and Lily's daughters loved playing on the beach, trying out snorkeling for the first time, and of course having a photo shoot as girls in their 20's like to do. For Lily and I, the hike to the lighthouse was the highlight of the day. With all the exploring we did on this island I never did find out the origin of the island's name. It has to be a gruesome story, right?!?

Seven miles to the northwest of Isla Caja de Muertos is Ponce, the second largest town on the island of Puerto Rico. The problem with Ponce is that being such a large city it is not great for boats. Don't get me wrong, you will find grocery stores, laundry, parts, and rental cars, which is what we needed because sadly the girls' time with us had run out and we needed to get them to San Juan for their flight. The problem is that even though Ponce is on a two and half mile long bay there is only one good spot to take your dinghy to get ashore. That spot is next to the yacht club, but don't try to use the yacht club because they are not very welcoming to visitors. Instead there is a fishing cooperative deeper into the bay that told us it was no problem to leave the dinghy for the day. From there you can get an Uber into town for \$10-15. Once in town there are a few sights to see including coffee plantations and a 150 plus year old firehouse still in service.

After dropping the girls off and driving back, we took advantage of the rental car by doing laundry and getting provisions before setting sail 15 miles towards Cayos de Cana Gorda where Gilligan's Island can be found. Obviously not the island from the TV show, but it kind of felt that way. The best part of Gilligan's Island was the large waist deep, white sand, pool-like area in front of the dock and snorkeling the mangrove channel leading away from it. You will be fighting the current in the 20 foot wide channel, but it was 10 plus feet deep and had lots of fish to see. The coolest part is that when you turn around, or round the corner to circumnavigate the island, you will zip along like you are on a conveyor belt. Very cool and a place we relaxed for a few days since it was also well protected.









When we did leave, it was to sail 10 miles west to Bahia Fosforescente, because I had a surprise for Lily. The bay is quite protected because you have to sail through a fairly narrow channel before it opens up into a decent size bay. Lily was wondering why we were there, since it is totally mangrove lined and there is absolutely nothing around. I asked her to be patient and once the sun totally set around 7pm tour boats started entering the bay for 30 minutes to an hour and it was then that I showed Lily her surprise. You see, this is one of several bays around Puerto Rico that is known for bioluminescence and the only one that you can swim in. Bioluminescence is tiny sea creatures that glow when agitated. Imagine lighting bugs, but in the water. It was an absolutely amazing sight and skinny dipping with glow in the dark glitter all over us will go down as one of my most romantic memories ever. While the tour boats came and went with barely any time to enjoy the experience, we spent the better part of two hours soaking it all in. Needless to say, Lily loved the surprise!

Bahia Fosforescente is a bay within a larger 6-7 mile long bay that is surrounded with different reefs and small islands. I feel like it would be possible to anchor in a different spot each day for a week inside this larger bay. The two anchorages we checked out were Arrecife Enmedio and Arrecife Laurel (Arrecife means reef in Spanish). Both of these gave pretty good protection and you can enjoy them as a day anchorage and guite possibly overnight depending on weather. The reef knocks down the waves, but not the breeze. We found the snorkeling around both to be enjoyable.







From Arrecife Laurel it is a quick 5 mile down wind sail to Cabo Rojo and then another five miles up the west coast to Boqueron. While it was fun sailing around the southwest corner of Puerto Rico, and the charts show an anchorage on the leeward side of Cabo Rojo, we did not stop. From what I read and saw, this anchorage gets quite rolly and we decided why to anchor there since Boqueron is such a beautiful and protected bay. We basically were able to choose anywhere along a mile long beach to drop the hook with no one to bother us. Of course that isolation was part of the problem when we went to leave. You see, even though there is a small yacht club, there is no fuel in Boqueron. For that you have to sail 3 miles north to the next bay, Puerto Real. The other issue is that Mayaguez, ten miles north, is the port of entry instead of Boqueron. Luckily, all we had to do to check out was simply submit a form online and do a video call. Since we were setting sail for the Dominican Republic, 100 plus miles to the west, we had to make sure we got exit papers emailed to us to give to the DR officials.

We loved our westward cruise along the southern side of Puerto Rico and were excited that it was the first in many new adventures as we head westward to Central America and then

down to Panama over the next couple years. Before I sign off I want to impart one piece of advice to anyone wanting to sail here. Puerto Rico is big enough that the island creates its own wind. Overnight and in the morning the cold air is settling down the mountains and pushes against the trade winds. This means you will find north winds more often than east and it will be lower than the trades. Conversely, by late morning until sunset, warm air is rising up the mountains and pulls the trade winds with it. This means the typical 15 knots can climb as high as 30 knots. With this knowledge I recommend anyone trying to go upwind to get to the Virgin Islands leave each day before sunrise and anchor no later than noon. This will give you smooth seas and possibly some sailing opportunities. If you are headed westward like we were then you will want to wait a bit long before heading out so you can get more wind for the downwind sails. 0



hether it's the catch-and-release of big bill-fish like blue marlin, white marlin, and sail-fish, or the catch-and-keep of good-eating gamefish like tuna, wahoo, and dolphin, there's a tournament held in the Bahamas and the Caribbean to suit every sport fisherman. The migration of species, as well as the natural abundance of fish in the Atlantic Ocean and Caribbean Sea that borders the islands, means that something is always in season. This means that one or more tournaments are happening every month of the year somewhere in this region. Case in point, Grenada's Spice Island Billfish Tournament kicks off the year in late January, and this year

welcomed boats from four islands, with Hard Play from Tobago the winner. Bonaire also ran its Nos ku Nos Billfish Tournament in Bonaire in January. Some islands, like Aruba, with its International Classic Billfish Tournament in October, round out the end of the year. For these events, it's BYOB (bring your own boat) or charter.

Notable too is that many Caribbean tournaments are qualifiers for the Super Bowl of Sportfishing, namely the Offshore World Championships (OWC), held each April in Quepos, Costa Rica. The Top Boat teams from Qualifying Events earn an entry. Qualifying tournaments in the Caribbean in 2022




included the Marina Casa de Campo Open in the Dominican Republic in March, the Cayman Islands Fishing Tournament in April, Antigua & Barbuda Sport Fishing Tournament in June, the Port Antonio International Marlin Tournament and Montego Bay Yacht Club's Annual International Blue Marlin Fishing Tournament in September, the Martinique International Fishing Tournament in October, and St. Maarten Wahoo Tournament in November. In 2016, out of 66 teams representing 29 nations, the OWC winner and runner-up were Caribbean teams from Trinidad & Tobago and Jamaica, respectively. Talk about putting the Caribbean on the global fishing map. Over a half dozen teams from the Bahamas and

Caribbean are fishing in the 2023 OWC, April 16-21 (www. offshoreworldchampionship.com).

Here's a sample of what's happening fishing-wise and tournaments taking place in 2023:

THE BAHAMAS. The Abaco Beach Resort & Marina is the venue for three tournaments. The first of these is the White Marlin Round-Up, April 19-22. "Over 30 boat's fish and the number of fish caught is impressive," says Captain Skip Smith, tournament director. The other two are the Shootout - Production Vs. Custom, on May 3-6; and the Custom Shootout,

May 17-20. "The big trend is sonars. We thought dredges were the fad, but sonars are the new big thing." Good fishing over the past few years, plenty of bars and restaurants to reach by boat, and fun fishing for bonefish and snapper on the tournament lay days are what makes Bahamas fishing great, says Smith. www.skipstournaments.com

**TURKS & CAICOS ISLANDS.** The Wine Cellar Golf & Fishing Tournament, March 9-12, is a fun-filled, family-oriented, three-day weekend event that moves back to IGY's Blue Haven Marina this year in Providenciales. "Two days of fishing, March 10 and 11, are each followed by a fresh fish auction of the day's catch, music, and entertainment. Species allowed

are wahoo, dolphin (mahi mahi), and tuna," says Desmond Williams, an organizing committee member. The golf tournament happens on March 12. All proceeds are donated to charity. In eleven years, the event has raised nearly \$400,000 for youth organizations. *golfandfishingtci.com* 

**DOMINICAN REPUBLIC.** Major fishing tournaments take place out of Punta Cana and Casa de Campo. In Casa de Campo, the billfish season runs from February 1 through May 30. The Marina Casa de Campo (MCDC) Open, March 16-18, features awards for blue marlin, white marlin, and sailfish. Trends are sports fishermen being more interested in preserving the species with the Open 100% catch-and-release, according to





Vilma Nunez, MCDC marketing manager. "New too, people are finally more willing to travel after the pandemic. We have a new Premier Club for those who want five-star service and accommodations along with world-class fishing." The MCDC Cup is in April. marinacasadecampo.com.do

PUERTO RICO. Club Nautico de San Juan's International Billfish Tournament (IBT) celebrates its 70th annual Platinum Edition, August 21-27. A big part of the fishery here is FADs or Fish Aggregating Devices. "They generate a lot of food in their surrounding area and attract fish," says Tito Saavedra, owner of the 2022 Top Boat, Sari Victoria, a 72' Viking. Last year too, the Legado Azul Foundation and the group Bluetide installed 22 FADs, 8 on the surface and 14 underwater, in the zone where the tournament takes place. A signature feature of the IBT is the unique rotation system, which allows visiting anglers to fish on different competing boats every day. www.sanjuaninternational.com

U.S. VIRGIN ISLANDS. The Dolphin Derby (April 2) and Wahoo Windup (October 22) are the two big gamefish tournaments hosted by the Virgin Islands Game Fishing Club, in St. Thomas. "Traditionally, we saw a lot of big boats from Florida come down. The owners of those boats are getting older now and the younger generation either doesn't want a whole fishing program with a hired captain and crew. There's




much more interest in smaller center consoles. So, for us, it's all about focusing locally and reinventing our events to attract the next generation," says Kelvin Bailey, Jr., Club president. The Club hosts a Kid's Tournament (September 30) at IGY's American Yacht Harbor, which features free handlines, pizza, and prizes. www.vigfc.com


**ST. MAARTEN.** The 2023 SXM Wahoo Tournament will return to two days of fishing, says Sergio Hodge, president of the Sint Maarten Sportfishing Foundation (SSFF). "The tournament attracts fishermen both locally and regionally to compete each November for lucrative prizes and bragging rights. November is in the midst of our wahoo season and over the years has earned the reputation of a well-attended

fisherman pelagic showdown." One of the top Caribbean fishing trends Hodge sees is high-speed trolling. Fishermen have noticed the difference in results between the different trolling techniques." sxmsportfishing.com

**ANTIGUA & BARBUDA.** Last year saw the Antigua & Barbuda Sports Fishing Tournament (May 25-28) in a new venue at Falmouth Harbour Marina. "This will be another exciting year with boats competing in two divisions, Marlin (blue marlin, white marlin, and sailfish) and Sport (wahoo, kingfish, tuna, and dolphin)," says Robert Hall, tournament director. A newer variety of food and entertainment for anglers and patrons ashore after fishing is also on tap. There will be new prizes too. www.antiguabarbudasportsfishing.com









**BARBADOS.** The latest and most exciting trend here has been the Government's FAD program. In November 2021, eight FADs were deployed along the island's west coast to encourage fishermen to target larger pelagic rather than reef fish. "By utilizing these FADs, fishermen have experienced more consistent success targeting species such as wahoo/kingfish, dolphin, amberjacks, tuna, blue marlin, and sailfish," says Paul Hamel-Smith, Barbados Game Fishing Association (BGFA) director. The BGFA's biggest tournament is the Sir Charles Williams International Fishing Tournament, set for Port St. Charles Marina, April 11-16. The target species are billfish (i.e. blue marlin, white marlin, sailfish, and spearfish). There are also fantastic prizes for other pelagic fish species such as wahoo/kingfish, dolphin, and yellowfin tuna. bgfa.profishingtournaments.com

TRINIDAD & TOBAGO. The Trinidad & Tobago Game Fishing Tournaments are back on the schedule after a pandemic pause. These include a marlin tournament, April 25-29; a junior angler tournament, July 8; a tarpon tournament, July 29-30; and a kingfish tournament, date pending. "The marlin tournament will be in Charlotteville, Tobago. Prizes will be awarded for dolphin, wahoo, yellowfin tuna, blue marlin, white marlin, and sailfish. The other three tournaments will be held in Trinidad. We are hoping for an exciting and successful tournament year," says Monique Sheppard, office administrator. www.ttgfa.com 0



All in all, it is an excellent, HURRICANE-FREE place to sail, chill and get some boatyard work done.





Our sister marina, Compass Point Marina, which has 195 slips, is just South of Independent Boatyard & Marina in Benner Bay bordering the entry channel. Compass Point Marina does do transient slip rental on a space available basis. Both marinas due to their location in a hurricane hole, allow vessels to remain in their slips during the hurricane season provided vessels comply with our written hurricane tie-off plan.

Adjacent to our slipway is a floating staging dock used by vessels slated for haulout.


















here are public governmental and private sector marine organizations that keep boaters safe at sea. It might be in operations like search and rescue (SAR), or towing a disabled craft to shore. However, the Caribbean, like other areas of the world, is also blessed with very capable volunteer organizations that in many cases make life and death differences.

A good example, and one of many, is the remarkable rescue that happened on October 13, 2014, as Hurricane Gonzalo bore down on St. Martin. Seven members of SNSM St. Martin, the local branch of the Paris headquartered Les Sauveteurs en Mer (SNSM), left their homes and families and stood ready to help. Despite alert messages, many sailors in bays around Sandy Ground, Marigot, and Grand Case remained on board their vessels. Emergency calls for man overboards and vessel groundings started rolling in as winds rose, visibility deteriorated and waves shook their rescue vessel, with both engines ultimately lost. The trained SNSM St. Martin volunteers jumped into the water with lifesaving equipment at the ready and helped to get survivors safely ashore to the beach. When the storm passed, more than 20 boats were stranded in Marigot Bay alone and 31 people





were rescued or assisted. For this, members of the SNSM St. Martin received a certificate from the International Maritime Organization for their acts of selflessness and sense of duty.

### **SEAFARING VOLUNTEER ORGANIZATIONS**

SNSM St. Martin, created in 2001 with sixty members and two vessels, is one of several volunteer marine organizations in the Caribbean.

"Our primary mission is to rescue people," says Nicolas Obry, secretary. "The crew members also go out for towing missions."







Another organization is Antigua & Barbuda Search and Rescue (ABSAR), founded in 1997 after an unsuccessful rescue of two Hobie Cat sailors sailing back to Antigua from Grenada. Today, the organization has a medic station at the Antigua Yacht Club Marina and treats over 1000 cases annually.

"ABSAR is run 24/7 and 365 days a year by a group of volunteers with extensive medical, marine, aviation, and firefighting backgrounds. We currently have a 28' Protector RIB and a 27' Revenger RIB for our rescues and event support," says Jonathan Cornelius, director, who in 2020 was one of 10 nominees for the MaritimeMT Crew Awards lifetime achievement category.

On May 21, 2014, ABSAR was part of a multinational SAR operation following the explosion of a motor vessel carrying freight between Antigua and Barbuda. Three survivors of four missing persons were successfully found paddling in a small inflatable boat and taken to the hospital.

Virgin Islands Search and Rescue (VISAR), in the British Virgin Islands, started in the 1980s to fill a critical gap in search and rescue services, according to Phil Aspinall, operations manager. "While statistically, most rescue organizations operate on a 90% Search and 10% Rescue, we are the opposite. Consequently, our crews are highly trained in Advanced First Aid,









and around half of them are the equivalent of EMTs. Uniquely, we have designed and equipped our vessels to be able to provide a stable platform enabling CPR to be performed while underway at speed."

The U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary (USCGAUX), the volunteer arm of the U.S. Coast Guard, has several flotillas in Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands.

"Public education in boating and seamanship is one of our primary initiatives. Each year in May, May 20-26, 2023 this coming year, our flotillas host educational activities for the

public as part of the Safe Boating Campaign," says Kenneth Vargas, division commander of the USCG Auxiliary flotilla in Aguadilla.


### **SAFETY ON THE SEA**

Years of experience in these organizations have made leaders well-qualified to offer the most important advice for safety on the sea.

"Always wear your lifejacket," says VISAR's Aspinall. "When Grandpa fell out of his boat in the old days, he got wet! With the speed and power of today's vessels, when you fall out it's









like hitting concrete. There's a chance you could be knocked unconscious. Better to be floating when we get there than to have sunk."

To ensure the best possible rescue, ABSAR's Cornelius recommends also carrying a working VHF and a registered EPIRB.

Have a 'float plan' so that someone is expecting you home and knows where you have gone, so that if you don't return, not only can the alarm be raised, but we also know where to go and find you, adds VISAR's Aspinall. "If the plan changes, update them."

Make sure your vessel is safe, says the USCGAUX Vargas. "In the complimentary Inspection Program, boat safety checks are made at the request of the owner or operator of the vessel and are free of charge. Once they pass the inspection, a Seal of Safety Decal is attached to the boat and is valid for one calendar year. With this seal, it is accredited that at the time of the inspection the vessel complied with federal and state regulations of safety equipment and that they were in good condition of use. These inspections are conducted by specially trained and qualified USCGAUX personnel which are certified as Vessel Examiners."





The bottle has two certification stamps - "Ron de Guatemala" Protected Designation of Origin (PDO) and ISCC Plus accreditation (International Sustainability and Carbon Certification). Botran's ISCC accreditation makes them the world's first sustainable rum across all aspects of the rum's journey from "from crop to drop." They are committed to sustainable practices such as reforestation, water management, waste management, clean energy, and safety.

The company has also moved from a traditional solera system to "Anejamiento Dinamico," or Dynamic Aging System. Instead of a pyramid structure, they created a vertical column stacked system using different casks in each column. After the rum is blended, the casks are repositioned, and the blending process is repeated. Over time, the younger rums in the column take on the bold flavors of the more aged rums.

Botran No. 15 is aged in American Whiskey, medium toasted American Whiskey, port, and sherry barrels for 5-15 years.

#### **HE SAID**

The nose is very tropical fruit forward with mild cherry, orange peel, and vanilla. The tropical fruit notes remind me of a freshly cut fruit bowl as the rum opens up. The palate has the same freshness as the nose, with nothing else presented. The finish opens up to reveal black cherry and an earthiness from tobacco. It has the complexity on the finish that I enjoy and sips like a properly aged rum.

# **SHE SAID**

The bronze color leaves light lacing on the glass. The nose has orange peel and a nutty note underneath the orange's brightness. I want to say it's raw almonds or walnuts. The palate is also bright, with the orange peel front and center with cinnamon coming in on the backside. The liquid coats my palate as if I were drinking a port or sherry; unfortunately, it doesn't carry those notes. My finish is warming, however, it doesn't open up in the way Clint describes.

## **OVERALL**

We both poured ourselves another glass to see where this rum took us. At \$38/bottle, this would be a great rum to share with friends to see what notes they find.
